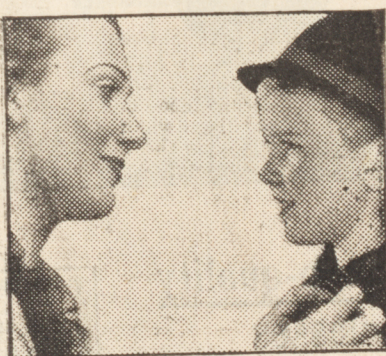

NORTH SHORE MAN LOSES LIFE AS CAR CRASHES BRIDGE

BATHURST, July 12—Frank C. Robichaud, 57, Six Roads, Gloucester County, was killed at 11 a. m. today, when a light car in which he was driving crashed through a bridge there to the water below.

Robichaud, with William Robichaud, was returning home from mass at Pokemouche. William Robichaud was bruised badly and shaken up.

The victim is survived by a wife and seven children. Dr. F. X. Comeau, Caraquet coroner, was summoned and, after viewing the body, arranged to hold an inquest tomorrow.

The victim was a passenger in the car operated by his brother, William. With him also was his 10 year old daughter, Argentine.

It was reported that William while passing another car on Whitley's bridge which is narrow and under construction, lost control of the machine, which plunged to a few feet of water 12 feet below. Frank Robichaud tried to jump clear, but landed in the brook, and the car overturned it was said. He died almost instantly. Doctor Ferguson a passer-by saved the little unhurt girl, who was struggling to safety.

JAPAN MILITARY

the trucks at Shanhaikwan, on the Chino-Manchurian frontier, after Chinese railway authorities refused to dispatch their troop trains over the railway southwest of Shanhaikwan to Tientsin and Peiping.

These reinforcements were believed en route to Fengtai, railway junction about halfway between Peiping and the fighting zone to the west. Fengtai has been the principal Japanese base of operations in this conflict.

Other Japanese troops from Manchuria were reported proceeding by special cars attached to regular trains on the Shanhaikwan-Peiping Railway.

Earlier this evening Japanese and Chinese alike indicated a new truce agreement had been reached. Japanese said the Chinese had accepted four demands. This the Chinese later denied, and Mayor Chin Teh-chun of Peiping cancelled an earlier announcement of an agreement.

Japanese sources said the four demands were:
1. Withdrawal of all Chinese troops from the region around Marco Polo bridge; 2. Punishment of the Chinese responsible for the conflict; 3. Adequate control of all anti-Japanese activities in North China; 4. Enforcement of measures against Communism.

Chinese asserted that the Japanese had violated a previous agreement to withdraw forces from the vicinity of Wanpinghsien, walled village in the centre of the troubled area. They declared a large force of Japanese with artillery was still there.

Japan tonight prepared for extensive military operations in China. The government announced more troops were being rushed to the North China zone where Japanese and Chinese soldiers have been locked in intermittent but bloody combat since Wednesday night.

The high command dispatched one of its most trusted commanders, Lieut.-Col. Kiyoshi Katsuki, by airplane to take command of Japanese forces in North China.

These decisions were made public after a day of conferences, in which high military and political leaders laid their views on the Peiping crisis before the Emperor himself.

It was announced that in view of the gravity of the situation Emperor Hirohito and Empress Nagako would return to Tokyo tomorrow from Hayama, seaside resort southwest of the capital where they have been summering.

China moved today to meet the threat of large-scale Japanese military operations in North China.

A government spokesman said Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek, leader of the Nanking regime, was moving 50,000 troops northward by the Peiping-Hankow Railway.

At present these troops were said to be between the Yangtze and Yellow rivers, principally in Honan Province.

"China realizes that Japan is trying to make Hopei Province another Manchukuo," declared T. T. Li, spokesman of the Foreign Office in the first official Nanking comment on the crisis.

Hopei is the province which contains Peiping and Tientsin and in which Japanese military and economic influence has been increasing the last four years. Manchukuo is the protectorate established by Japan in China's former Manchurian provinces.

"China still hopes to settle the incident peacefully," Li continued, "but further operations will meet China's unreserved opposition. We hope for peace but frankly are pessimistic about it. More trouble seems to be inevitable."
