Boston Bees Nose Out New York Giants 3 to 1

Bobby Weir Bests Schumacher in Hurling Duel

NEW YORK, May 3—Bobby Weir, Boston's sophomore southpaw, today chalked up his first victory of the season with a six-hit pitching performance that topped the Giants 3-1 in Boston.

The defeat, the New Yorkers' fourth, dropped them a game behind the idle first-place Pirates.

One bad inning lost the game for Hal Schumacher, Bill Terry's starting pitcher, who was lifted for a pinch-hitter in the eighth, when the losers scored their only run.

In the fourth the Bees massed four of their six hits for all of their runs. Hal Warstler singled to right, took third on Gene Moore's single to the same sector, and scored on Tony Cucinello's double.

Vince Di Maggio then crashed a

line drive off third baseman Lou Chiozza's glove, scoring Moore and Cucinello.

Scoring six runs in the last two innings after the Dodgers had rallied and tied the score in the sixth, the Phillies gained a 14-8 upper hand in a wild and woolly game in Brooklyn.

NEW YORK, May 9—A home run by Hank Greenberg with the bases full set off an attack that enabled the Tigers to defeat Chicago White Sox 12-9 in Detroit today, sweeping the series and strengthening their hold on first place in the American Baseball League.

The Tigers were trailing by four runs when Greenberg walloped the ball over the scoreboard in the third inning, scoring White and Cochrane, who had singled, and Gehring who had walked.

SCHMELING BACK IN U. S. TO START TRAINING FOR GO

NEW YORK, May 3—Max Schmeling came back from Germany today to begin training for a prize fight that may never be held.

Exactly one month from today, the temperamental Teuton is booked to fight James J. Braddock for the world's heavyweight title in Madison Square Garden's big bowl in Long Island City.

But while Schmeling goes to Speculator, N. Y., to whip himself into condition, the champion is in the mid-west training for a bout with the brown bombing Joe Louis in Chicago.

No promotion has been done on either fight. Both the Garden and the men back of the Chicago venture are awaiting the ruling of Judge Guy Fake of Newark on The Garden's application for an order restraining Braddock from fighting Louis until he has fulfilled his contract to defend his title first against Schmeling.

"I have a contract with Madison Square Garden to fight Braddock on June 3 and I intend to live up to every detail," Max said.

"If there is no fight, we shall see what we shall see. The New York State Athletic Commission has promised to protect my interests."

Certified Seed Potatoes

(Experimental Farms Note)

Profit in potato production is very largely dependent upon seed quality. The quality of the seed cannot be estimated accurately by the appearance of the tubers only. It is necessary to know that those tubers are the product of healthy and vigorous plants. It is a mistake to believe that all potatoes of "good appearance" are healthy and therefore, satisfactory as seed. There are troubles known as "virus diseases" which include several diseases that cannot be seen either on the tubers or inside them but can be detected only by examining the plants during the growing season. When these virus diseases are present in the crop they very seriously retard the growth of the plants and reduce the yield and also the percentage of marketable potatoes. In fact, the virus diseases are responsible for most of the so-called "running out" of potatoes and the consequent lowering of the yields. If purchasing seed potatoes, the only way to be sure of getting good quality seed is to obtain Certified Seed.

Certified seed potatoes are produced especially for seed purposes from healthy and vigorous plants, and must be of good type and true to variety. They are the product of those crops which have been officially inspected for disease and other troubles of plants during the growing season and again after the tubers are harvested; a product which has been found relatively free from serious defects at each inspection. Such potatoes are practically free from diseases. It was in order to assist the growers of potatoes in the production of more profitable crops by the use of better quality seed that the Dominion Department of Agriculture organized a system of inspection and certification of seed potatoes, based on the inspection of the plants during the growing season and of the tubers after they are harvested. Those certified crops must conform to definite and quite high standards which are uniform for all of Canada.

To each sack, or other package, of certified seed which the grower sells he is required to attach an official certification tag issued to him by an official of the Dominion Department of Agriculture. Purchasers should look for this tag on each sack, or other package of potatoes that is offered to them as certified seed, and if it is not there, the potatoes should not be accepted as certified seed.

There are only two legal grades of seed potatoes in Canada, and these are "Certified Seed," and "Certified Seed, Small." The former grade includes tubers from 3 ozs. to 12 ozs. in weight and the latter grade includes those from 1-1/2 ozs. in weight. Except for the difference in size of the tubers, the standards for both these grades are the same. The official certification tag states which grade of seed is contained within the sack. It is now illegal to advertise or to sell any other potato as seed or for seed purposes in Canada. In advertising other potatoes here they must be designated by one of the grade names that apply to table stock potatoes, such as Canada No. 1, or Canada No. 2. It should be clearly understood, however, that although it is illegal to advertise table stock as seed potatoes, no one is prohibited from purchasing properly labelled table stock grades for seed purposes. Certified seed potatoes can be purchased from most of the seed dealers or from the seed growers direct. Lists of growers who have this seed for sale can be obtained free from the Dominion Botanist, Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa, or from the District Inspector, Seed Potato Certification Service within the Province. Although the initial cost of this seed is a little more than for ordinary potatoes, it is good economy to use the best seed obtainable in planting the crop. The increased yield per acre from the best seed will many times repay the extra cost of the seed, as has been proven in many experiments conducted with "Certified Seed" versus "Uncertified potatoes" grown under the same conditions.

Defending Champions Toppled By Centrals

Porter Loses to Conn and Martel

SAINT JOHN, May 4—Two major upsets featured the opening of the Maritime-Eastern Maine annual bowling tournament which got under way last night on the Imperial Alleys here.

Black's, the defending champions, were toppled by Centrals in the 7:30 o'clock games and Porter's, after winning from Y.M.C.I. of Saint John, went down to defeat at the hands of Conn and Martel, Halifax, in the 9:30 games.

Six teams came through the opening sessions unscathed while Sussex has yet to roll its first game. Moncton five reached Saint John last night in time to fill in on the schedule for one of the two teams which dropped out, although the Hub team had been slated to roll in the early hours.

Centrals of Saint John, Fredericton, Conn and Martel of Halifax, Halifax Imperials, Sydney and Stellarton all came through with a victory each while Porter's of Saint John took the middle spot in the standing with a win and a loss. Porter's were forced to roll twice due to Sussex not being slated to come to Saint John until this morning.

The tournament was officially opened by Councillor R. L. Grannan, who after calling on the competitors to show sportsmanlike procedure throughout the week's grind, rolled the first ball and declared the 1937 classic opened.

Centrals provided the first upset of the night when they knocked off the strong Black collection. Morris Blacks 130 in the opening string was just enough to give the defending champions the edge but in the second the three of the Black clan faltered and hit below the 90 mark. The champions fought back in the third, coming down the home stretch but their margin was not enough to offset the big edge Centrals took in the second.

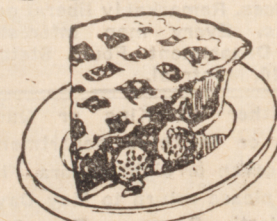

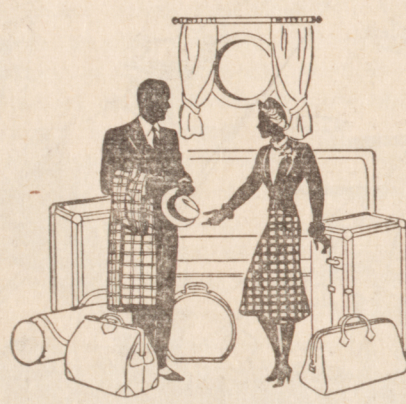

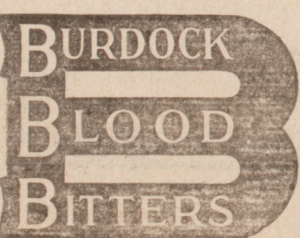
