Bygone days in Carleton County are reviewed by the Carleton Sentinel. Two or three items published this week will be of interest to local readers. December 15th, thirty years ago, C. D. Three Canadian university students will give brief addresses to the 300 student delegates assembled at the National Conference of Canadian University Students when that body opens its sessions in Winnipeg, Monday evening, Dec. 27. Two of the students have been selected. They are Ian McKeegan of Dalhousie University, Halifax, and Miss Margaret Brown, University of Manitoba. A third student a French-Canadian from the University of Montreal will be selected this week. General theme of the three addresses will be "A Student Looks at the World."

Carefully prepared papers and reports which have been under discussion on university campuses for many weeks will be brought to the Winnipeg Conference by accredited delegates of Canadian universities. More than 10,000 students have participated in study groups, discussing contents of the questions to be discussed at the Conference.

For instance, a group of students from Saskatchewan will bring to the Winnipeg conference a report on the drought situation and the future of Saskatchewan. British Columbia students have prepared a presentation on the Oriental problem on the Pacific Coast. French-Canadian students from McGill and the University of Montreal are prepared to talk about the bi-racial problem. In this way problems of each province will be thrown open for discussion by students from every part of Canada.

National Secretaries of the Student Christian Movement of Canada have been devoting their entire time recently to the promotion of the Conference which is sponsored by them, although the Conference is open to all Canadian students.

Students from the University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, and Mt. Allison University, Sackville, will leave tomorrow for the National Federation of Canadian University students being held in Winnipeg from Dec. 27 to 31.

The students chosen to represent Mt. Allison are Senior class: Stephen Clark, Saint John, and Archie Cameron, Stellarton, N.S.; Junior class: Della McFarland. Sophomore class, Kay Frances; Freshman class; Alastair McLeod.

University of New Brunswick, Senior class: Allison S. Mitchell, Welchpool; Jack H. Thurrott, Fredericton; John W. D. McKnight, Fredericton; Junior class: Miss Margaret L. Clark, Saint John; Miss Norma Linton, Fairville, and Prof. MacPherson.

Mr. Thurrott who is co-editor of The Brunswickian, will remain for some time after the closing of the conference to attend a meeting of the editors of Canadian university publications.

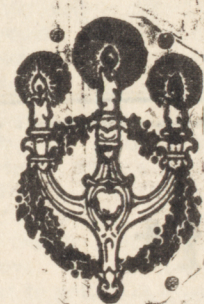
