And in the Southrn States of America, where the white population is mainly of British rigin and about every adult is a nember of either a Baptist or Methodist Church, the rights of the Negro receive about as much consideration as those of the Jew in Gernany! All this evil clearly comes from faulty concepts as to what is rue education and what is genuine ligion. Is the University a Necessity?

What of those who cannot attend University? A university education is necessary for the higher grades of leadership, but the actual university degree is not as necessary as often urged.
