
These Simple Suggestions, If Followed by Everyone In The Family, Will Make Your Home Safe From Fire

### PREVENT FIRES

1. DON'T LIGHT YOUR FIRE WITH KERO-SENE.

DONT'S FOR THE HOUSEHOLDER

- 2. DON'T turn on the draft in your cook-stove and leave the room. If the stove overheats it may set fire to wood partitions or soot in the pipes or flues.
- 3. DON'T set your stove on the bare floor without a metal sheet or asbestos pad beneath it.
- 4. DON'T place your stove nearer than 18 inches from the wall and don't forget to protect the wall behind it with a sheet of zinc loosely hung on hooks to give an air space between the metal protector and the wall.
- 5. DON'T throw water on blazing fat or grease. It only spreads the flame. Use ashes, baking soda, flour or salt.
- 6. Have your chimney cleaned every fall.
- 7. See that your stove pipes are in good condition and protected by a metal collar where they pass through a roof, wall, floor or ceiling. KARL WALKER, Chief, Fredericton Fire Department




