

Pepper Relish, Yellow Tomato Preserves and Carrot Jam in Pretty Jars Different, Appetizing

If carrot jam is new for your list, his is the how of it: Scrape and grate a quart of carrots. Wash two arge thick skinned oranges (or use three slices of canned pineapple cut n slivers, or half of each).

Peel the oranges and grind pulp of both. Cut the skin of one into thin strips. Cover these threads with water and simmer until tender. Steam the grated carrots until tender.

To them add the well drained strips of orange rind, the orange oulp, the juice of three lemons and one cup of water. Cook until thick. Then add two pounds of sugar and cook rapidly until clear and thick as honey. Add one half cup of chopped almonds and stir well. Put into sterized pretty little jars and seal air-

There is crabapple honey, too. For this you core and remove imperfections, but do not pare the fruit. Then run it through a food chopper and add water to barely cover the apples and boil 15 minutes. Add three quarters cup of sugar for every cup of cooked apple and continue cooking until clear and jeflylike. Put in tiny

jars and seal. Green tomato marmalade should also not be forgotten. Cut or chop three pounds of green tomatoes. Add three cups (1 1-3 pounds) of sugar. Cut three lemons paper-thin and cover the slices with one-half cup of water. Boil five minutes and add to the tomato and sugar mixture.
