#### Nine Pensions Grated

Examination of applicants has already been begun at Saint John by Dr. Hughes, two certificates stating fact of blindness having been received at the office of the Board this morning. Of the more than 400 applications received, pensions have been granted in nine cases so far, Mr. Jones said. It was possible to grant these without the medical examination because of the fact that they are among the fifteen blind applicants in N. B., who had certificates of blindness on record at the Department of Pensions and National Health at Ottawa, which certificates were transferred to the office of the N. B. Board at the request of Mr. Jones.

"We have already taken steps to arrange for the examinations to take place, and applicants will be advised as to the dates and places of the examinations," said Mr. Jones. "It is quite apparent," he added, "that the dates must be fixed for the different examinations, since it would be impossible for the physicians to handle the whole number of applicants should the latter choose the same day for their examinations."

#### Must Be Examined

"It may be stated that each pensioner must be examined, and that it is necessary for him to wait until he receives notice of the appointment with the physician from us. We cannot grant any pension until we receive a certificate as to the fact of blindness from the examining physician, or a similar certificate from the department at Ottawa. An examination certificate from any other physician except those authorized by the Dominion government absolutely cannot be accepted," he emphasized.

"The Board realizes that urgency is necessary in these matters, and is endeavoring to forward them as rapidly as possible. When the certificate is received, if everything is in order in respect to age, nationality, residence and income, the payment of a pension will be effective as from the day after the receipt of the application together with the necessary proofs in respect to age, nationality, residence and income, and not from the time the certificate establishing the fact of blindness is received," Mr. Jones pointed out. Thus, in some cases, pensioners will receive payments for the month of November as well as December, he said.
