## FAMOUS CAROL DRAMATIZED ON CBC PROGRAM

Story of "Good King Wenceslas" to be Told On "The Romance Of Sacred Song," Dec. 26

VANCOUVER, Dec. 24.—The popular Christmas carol, "Good King Wenceslas," will be dramatized on "The Romance of Sacred Song" on Sunday, Dec. 26, at 3 p.m. AST, when this feature is broadcast over the coast-to-coast network of the C B C from Vancouver.

The carol was found by Rev. J. M. Neale, foremost English translator of foreign hymns, in an old book of early 16th century Swedish hymns. He completed the translation and adapted his words to fit the music of the old carol.

Contrary to the regular plan of the programme, the carol itself and not the story of its writing will be dramatized. Script for the programme was written by Estelle Fox, and production will be under the direction of James Finlay.

## ROBERT RIPLEY TO PRESENT BLIND MUSICIANS

Also Present Ted Friend Who Was Great Benefactor of Musicians

## Got Job For Friend

Many Other Items of Interest On the Believe-It-Or-Not Program

On Christmas Night (Saturday) Robert L. ("Believe It or Not") Ripley will present another newspaper man, Ted Friend, amusement editor of the N. Y. Daily Mirror, revealing how Friend justified his name in paying a road to happiness for a blind musician. The musician will also appear on the program, to be broadcast via WEAF-NBC at 9.00 o'clock AST.

Ripley will tell how Friend, in the course of his reportorial rounds, met Phil Goldfarb, a blind musician of great promise, who was reduced to street musicianship for nickel and dime contributions. Goldfarb a classmate of the brilliant George Gershwin, is a former member of the Paul Whiteman and George Hall orchestras.

Instead of salvaging his conscience by making small contributions, Friend made his "After Dark" columnar pursuits an errand of mercy. He got Goldfarb a job in the floor show of New York's famous "Village Barn." Friend prevailed upon the management to "make" the job. Goldfarb acquitted it.

Friend's good-will gesture will be celebrated on the "Night of Good-Will," when Ripley reveals how Friend employed the original benefaction to organize the National Bureau for Blind Artists. It means the beginning of an orchestra comprised of blind musicians.

Appropriately, Goldfarb, Friend and the blind piano team of Virgil Bingham will appear on the Ripley show Christmas Night, launching an appeal for funds to further finance the formation of the nation's first Orchestra of Blind Musicians.

## CANADIAN BROADCASTING CORP. TO PRESENT "ROMEO AND JULIET" FROM METROPOLITAN OPERA ON DEC. 25

Richard Crooks, Noted American Tenor To Take Part Of Romeo, While Brazilian Soprano, Bidu Sayao, Will Be Juliet

## MANY FAMOUS SINGERS

Gounod's Version Of Shakespearean Work Claimed One Of Finest Versions

OTTAWA, Dec. 24.—"Romeo and Juliet," Gounod's operatic version of Shakespeare's immortal love drama against the background of feud between the Montagues and the Capulets, will be broadcast in full direct from the stage of the Metropolitan Opera on Christmas Day, Dec. 25, beginning at 3 p.m. AST, over the CBC national network. Bidu Sayao, Brazilian soprano, will be Juliet, and Richard Crooks, American tenor, will sing Romeo.

This opera the second most popular by Charles Gounod, is being performed for the first time in two years at the Metropolitan. It came into the Opera's repertory in 1891 and with it came three of the great stars of early Metropolitan history—Emma Eames, and Jean and Edouard de Reszke. In Saturday's broadcast performance, Frere Laurent, the part introduced by Edouard de Reszke, will be sung by Ezio Pinza Abravanel, great Italian basso.

Both of the leading singers in the performance to be broadcast by NBC are singing the opera for the first time at the Metropolitan. Bidu Sayao made her debut at the Metropolitan last season and drew fulsome critical praise for her work in bringing a freshness to youthful roles. A native of Brazil, she has sung in most of the important opera houses of the world, including La Scala in Milan, the Royal at Rome, the Paris Opera, the Colon at Buenos Aires and the Municipal in her native city, Rio de Janeiro. She is incidentally, a former pupil of Jean de Reszke.

Richard Crooks, born at Trenton, New Jersey, sang for many years in concert and European opera before

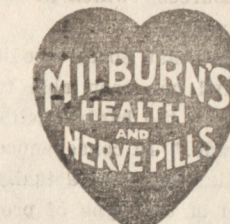
he made his Metropolitan debut five years ago.

The libretto of "Romeo and Juliet" more or less follows the text of Shakespeare's play. Capulet, a Venetian noble, is marking his daughter's debut into society with a masked ball. Romeo, a member of the enemy family, the Montagues, accosts Juliet and immediately falls in love with her. Frere Laurent later secretly unites the pair in marriage, hoping that the union will reconcile the families; but Romeo's imprudent page, Stephano, arouses the anger of a Capulet and a fight ensues in which Romeo, fighting to avenge the death of a friend kills Tybalt.

For this Romeo is banished by the Duke of Verona but first meets Juliet in the Capulet house. Frere Laurent, in order to help Juliet avoid marriage with Paris, gives her a potion that will throw her into a trance for 48 hours. She apparently dies and is placed in the burial vault of the Capulets. Romeo forces the door to gain one last glimpse of his bride, then drinks a deadly poison. The reviving Juliet has only time to bid her husband farewell before his death. In despair, she stabs herself.
