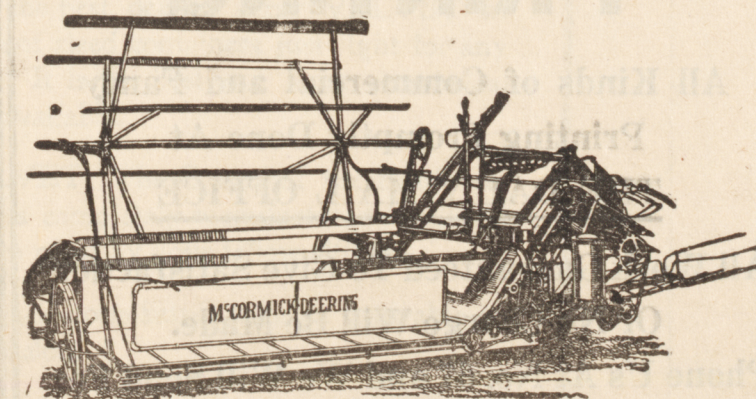

## FEW HAWAIIAN GIRLS DANCE

## Opposition of Missionaries Has Induced Parents To Forbid Ancient Dance

Hawaiian girls, scorned sneakers and shin guards, play soccer in their bare feet, Miss Pauline Frederick, instructor in physical education at the Kamehameha School for Girls in Honolulu, told women students of sports at the Columbia University Summer Session recently.

Hockey, soft ball, basketball and volleyball are played in the same primitive fashion. Stubbed toes and bruises are ignored, according to Miss Frederick, who said that shoeless athletics had developed hardness and skill not generally found among feminine athletes in United States.

Outside the play field, Honolulu girls are indistinguishable from their American sisters, Miss Frederick explained. They wear the latest American fashions and only when the school schedule calls for recreation do they discard their footwear.

Though swimming is regarded by Americans as a sport universally practiced in Hawaii, many native girls do not know how to swim, Miss Frederick disclosed. Kamehameha students who live in the mountainous inland or near shark-infested waters get their first ducking in the pool when they reach the school.

I should never expect to rival Robert Taylor in stage love-making. Surely it must be wonderful to a young girl to see such love and such perfect bliss! It is equally fascinating to read all about the numerous marriages and divorces of their 'perfect lovers.' It would be a still more marvelous and fascinating study if these love-struck girls could put one and one together—the stage love and the news paper stories of their real love affairs—and make some sense out of it.

Naturally the older women you like have more intelligence. The young girl lives under the delusion that she must be dumb if she is to attract a man. Perhaps she is right. The dumb ones seem to draw the crowd.

But I often wonder whether such girls are as dumb as they pretend to be. They are vivacious, lively and can say "Really," "Marvelous," "How wonderful" to a man so sincerely and so understandingly that he bites the bait. I sometimes feel like saying, "You just said marvelous. What exactly is so marvelous about it?"

Singing remains the great national entertainment of Hawaii and, Miss Frederick pointed out, is the island's greatest contribution to contemporary art. Music is a major field of study at the Kamehameha School, where membership in the glee club and other choral groups is most highly prized.

Picnic parties to the accompaniment of spontaneous song are great favorites with her students, Miss Frederick continued, but Hawaiian girls have no feeling for the campfire tradition so romanticized in the United States. After using a fire to fry eggs and toast marshmallows, they invariably stamp it out, preferring the tropical moon and the palm trees as the setting for their harmonies.

## All That Survive

While attaching no significance to fires and glowing embers, the Hawaiians preserve certain traditions, many of which are rooted in the old pagan religion. When crossing a stream, the girls never fail to place a rock, then a leaf, then another rock at the points where they enter the water. When hiking, they refrain carefully from picking flowers on the way to their destination, but gather huge bouquets on the way back. Failure to observe this rite would bring rain before the end of the trip, they firmly believe.
