The Irish Outrage

F THE NEWS WHICH COMES OVER THE WIRE FROM BEL-FAST TODAY IS TRUE—and if the outrage which took place on the border of the Free State is justly blamed on the extreme Irish Republicans, then the whole affair is a disgrace to those Irishmen residing south of the Ulster border. If, as the despatch states, the outrage was created by a gang of hoodlums then the the sooner that the Free State authorities line these people up and punish them the more creditable it will be to their own cause.

There have been bitter political differences regarding the Government of Ireland between those residing in Northern Ireland and those in the south but these differences should not be made the occasion of the outrage which took place yesterday when Their Majesties, the King and Queen paid their visit to Ulster. It is hoped that the whole matter will be investigated and that the blame will be placed where it belongs.

No one can deny to the Irish, both of the North and the South, the right of determining for themselves how they are to be governed. This is a right which we in Canada possess and of which we are jealous. But there is no excuse whatever for the disgraceful actions which took place yesterday.

Ireland is unfortunate in its home affairs. It has given to the world its share of poets, of statesmen and of leaders in world affairs. Its sons have gone to foreign lands and have become leaders. We have had examples of this in Canada where Irishmen have been amongst our leading patriots. Some of the best generals in the empire's wars have been men of Irish birth. They seem to have been able to make good in every land except their own.

Many of our news despatches from across the seas are untrue or overdrawn. This may be the case in regard to the reported incidents yesterday. The whole affair, however, seems to have been an unfortunate and disgraceful one, no matter how small its proportions may have been.

PEIPING, July 29-Severe fighting s reported in Northern China in the undeclared open civil war today. At Tientsin British, French and Italian troops threw up barricades early today to protect foreigners, against Highlands. fighting for Tientsin by Chinese and Japanese troops.
