## Partition Still the Solution

THE British Government's decision to let the Palestine partition plan stand over to allow for "adequate inquiry" is unquestionably the wise course. There are some issues which may be more easily adjusted in developing the details of the plan if full study and discussion are permitted at this stage. This does not mean that the Government contemplates altering its decision to carry out the general proposals made in the Royal Commission report.

There is a considerable body of influential, if partisan, opinion massed against the partition both inside and beyond Great Britain. Some idea of the strategy it intends to employ was had from Winston Churchill's performance in the House of Commons. It was he who asked the Government if it had done all that could be expected of it to persuade "one side to concede and the other side to forbear." (Any number of shallow questions such as this can be raised without doing anything to clarify the issue. The Government can prove its actions only to the extent that partisan opinion is willing to accept its proof.)

Another equally partisan demand is that which seeks assurance that Britain has done everything within her power in exercising the mandate for "maintenance of the status quo" in Palestine. The impossibility of maintaining a status quo between elements so widely separated in their ambitions and so unyielding to any sort of reasoning but martial law is the key to the Royal Commission's proposals. It is only logical that the difficulties in this regard will increase as the Arabs and Jews themselves increase and reach out for what each considers to be its indisputable rights and privileges.

A second factor favoring the postponement is that it will allow the numerous alternatives to be examined under the same critical conditions as the partition plan. Viscount Samuel, breaking twelve years' silence on the Palestine controversy, proposed one alternative to the House of Lords this week. Others have been offered from the United States, and, while the Zionist Congress is confidently expected to endorse the partition in "principle" at its Zurich conference next month, it is almost certain that further suggestions will be made.

All such plans go back to the idea that there is the possibility of mutual agreement on all the major issues, provided Britain continues to exercise the mandate. It has to be admitted that the partition is a drastic remedy, but no more drastic than the fundamental problems of Palestine. It is sure to cut across the interests of both factions, but not nearly as seriously as their own contradictory programs have done and will continue to do. The plan thus far is only a skeleton. All the details have yet to be decided, and if there is any spirit of compromise, a willingness to concede and forbear, on either side, it can be used to the best advantage in settling these.

## Poor Spain!

"FRIGHTFUL" losses to both sides are reported from the Madrid battlefront. Under a broiling copper sun the men of Spain have been fighting with almost incredible ferocity amid the putrefying bodies of thousands of their countrymen.

In this, then, the reward that was promised the voters of Spain by the various politicians of that country? Is this the economic paradise described in the political campaigns?

The war in Spain is no mere civil war, not alone mad mass fratricide. It is a conflict egged on by other nations whose concern for the individual Spaniard is less than nothing.

Yet the horror had its inception in the ranting of self-seeking politicians who inflamed hates and stirred their followers into a frenzy of destruction, yes, of self-destruction.

The fire that was started in the minds and hearts of many Spaniards by the politicians became a conflagration that found the rabble-rousers incompetent to restrain the destructive power they had unleashed.

So it can be anywhere in the world. Even well-intentioned men of small mind can stir trouble which, in full fury, dismays the very leaders who aroused it. Then these dismayed leaders plead that this was not their intent. They look to better men to repair the damage.

Little good that does the dead men of Spain, rotting under the July sun.

## Printing

THERE stands in the middle of the square in front of the Cathedral at Mainz, the ancient German city on the Rhine, a statue of Johann Gutenberg. He was the father of printing. We are the inheritors of a measureless wealth that he gave us.

He belonged to a family which had long been prominent locally. He served his apprenticeship as a stone-cutter. Studying the playing cards printed from one rough block, the little wood-cut pictures of saints and Bible characters and the curiously carved images which he made, it seemed to him there ought to be other ways of making books than laboriously writing them by hand.

One day he began cutting letters in wood and fixing them on a wooden block. It was the beginning of his printing press. A year or two went by and then Gutenberg printed a book from solid type—letters cut in a solid block of wood so that when that book was printed there could be no other use for the type.

Gutenberg foresaw a good deal. He remarked: "The printed book is not like any other art. A painter sketches his figures on the canvas and perfects the creation of his thought, the same with the poet, the engraver, the musician, we, on the contrary, with our presses, are only the servants of others."

The old man Gutenberg, who was born in 1400 and died in 1468, was right. The book has become everything and the printer almost nothing, yet without the printer where would the writer be and where would the whole world be now?

There are about 35,000 persons engaged in the printing trade in Canada and the average income of man, boy and girl is about \$1,300, according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Department of Trade and Commerce.

while a good many "heroes" and men and women with inferiority complexes have found some self-expression by strutting in his ranks he is not to be feared directly. The danger of Mozley's movement lies, rather, in its claiming all the attention and all the criticism which is directed against Fascism, while the Prime Minister, Neville Chamberlain, by his decrees, plays, unnoticed, a far deadlier Fascist rule. The picture that comes to my mind is that of a fire department working overtime to put out a burning shack, a place in which no one would live while just around the corner a home filled with

the most precious of the treasures of democracy, is smouldering, ready to burst into flames.

Mozley's men and women are not permitted to parade in uniform, but the women wear sweaters and a broad, black belt with a huge buckle. We passed one of these Amazons later on this Sunday evening.

Whitehall, the home of the Government offices, is just a block or so away from Trafalgar. While passing, we stopped at a very ordinary corner and read a name-plate very little different from hundreds of others—except that it had written on it "Downing Street!"

Our host, the tutor, was determined that we should get to sleep without rocking that night. We began the evening at a restaurant where the menu was in French and German. He knew both, so the rest of us did not have to point, and wonder what we had ordered.

Then came our first ride on the Underground or Tube. We had sufficient pennies to use the automatic ticket machines—which was rather fun—then we went down stairs and escalators, at least a hundred feet, to the station platform. The train shot out of the tunnel. We got on board and in a second or so were roaring under London at a terrific speed. Then, out and up to the surface on reversed escalators, and we were at the Marble Arch, one of the corners of Hyde Park.

Crowds were gathered about "soap box" orators. We wandered from group to group. Two or three of the perspiring gentlemen were on the subject of religion, and each had his own pet ideas. One was leading several hundred people in Moody and Sankey hymns. Another was predicting the end of the world with a vehemence that surely must have hurried the process. And the most interesting of all was a Negro from South Africa. He was explaining with a brilliant marshalling of statistics, just how British Imperialists and capitalists were squeezing the very

esties. Police said they also had discovered a plot to wreck the trains carrying police and other visitors to Belfast on their return to the Londonderry area. A mine was discovered beneath the railway line at Temple Patrick in County Antrim.

The explosion within Belfast was one of a series of acts of violence during the day, attributed by police to extremist Irish Republicans.

Feeling ran high in Belfast last night and police purposely withheld announcement of the mine plant until after departure of the King and Queen aboard the Royal yacht, Victoria and Albert.

Even as they sailed homeward to the strains of "Come Back to Erin" another disorder occurred west of Belfast. A police constable patrolling at Dunville Park was surrounded by a gang of 40 men, several of whom drew guns, disarmed the officer and then fled.

Explosives and the bag had been placed against a store and to the explosives was attached a considerable length of fuse—possibly a time fuse. The fuse was found and is in possession of police.

More than 1,000,000 Ulstermen turned out to watch the King and Queen drive through the streets of Belfast to the city hall where the King expressed his and Her Majesty's pleasure at the opportunity once again to renew our acquaintance with our loyal people of Northern Ireland, whom we wish ever-increasing prosperity and happiness.

## Along the Border

Along the Free State border Irish hoodlums ran amok. Twenty-eight Free State and Ulster customs huts were burned along the boundary line from Carlingford in the east to Bundoran, County Donegal, in the west.

Raiders at Newry, County Down, held up with a machine gun a patrol of the Royal Ulster Constabulary who were forced to pour gasoline on a burning hut.

Northern Railway line at Lislimnagh appeared in court at Amagh last today. In their possession were found a service rifle, a revolver, ammunition and wire cutters. All were remanded in custody until Aug. 4.

The railway line near Dundalk, in the Free State, was dynamited only ten minutes after a crowded excursion train, bound for Belfast, and the celebration, had passed. Another train carrying 400 excursionists was delayed almost three hours and arrived in Belfast too late for the occupants to see the Royal procession.

Thousands of police standing shoulder to shoulder lined the route along which the King and Queen drove after disembarking from the Royal yacht Victoria and Albert. From the official reception at the City Hall the Royal party went to a state luncheon at Government House and later to a garden party.

In the afternoon they drove to Balmoral Field to watch a parade of youth organizations. They remained in their car, driving slowly around the field while 2,000 youngsters cheered. Their Majesties departed for England tonight.
