

The real masters of the science have always felt that to achieve this end it is necessary to make some substantial contribution to the welfare of humanity."

Mr. Strange said that in 1922 he had been attracted to the science of Phrenology some years after his arrival in Canada from England. He studied the subject in Toronto with H. B. Farmer one of the most prominent of Canadian phrenologists.






