**Dysart, Bordage**  
**Only Two Survivors**  
**Of 1917 Election**

Twenty-one years ago today the Liberal party in New Brunswick led by Hon. W. E. Foster now president of the Senate of Canada, was returned to power in this province. Now after twenty-one years have rolled around and the New Brunswick Legislature of today opens on the twentieth anniversary of that election. We find only two men sitting in the House who were elected in the election held in February 24th, 1917. These two men are Hon. A. A. Dysart, Premier of the Province and his colleague A. J. Bordage, both of whom have represented Kent County continuously ever since 1917. It is probably a record in Canada that two representatives have been continued session after session to represent the same constituency for so long a time. The late Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberts who passed away a few days ago was also elected in the Foster election of 1917, but Dr. Roberts was out of the House from the defeat of the Veniot Government in 1925 until the return of the Dysart Party in 1935.

**DISMISS APPEAL**  
**WITH COSTS IN**  
**INSURANCE SUIT**

**White Case Dismissed**  
**On Failure to Post**  
**Security For Cost**  
**Of Appeal**

The appeal was dismissed with costs in the action of Clara White, executrix of the estate of the late C. J. H. Parker vs. the North British and Mercantile Insurance Company, Ltd., heard at an adjourned sitting of the Appeal Division of the Supreme Court here this morning before Chief Justice J. B. M. Baxter and Mr. Justice Harrison. The appellant had failed to provide security for costs to the extent of \$150, pursuant to an order of the court made February 8. C. F. Inches, K.C., Saint John, appeared for the respondent and moved for dismissal of the appeal.

Ronald Donald Taylor, Montreal, head of the legal department of the Sun Life Assurance Co., was readmitted as a barrister and solicitor of the province of New Brunswick this afternoon. He was admitted to the bar in New Brunswick in 1922 and moved to Montreal several years later. C. F. Inches, K. C. moved for his readmission.

**Coal Prospecting**  
**In York County**

Coal prospecting is in progress in York County near Millville, where the presence of this mineral was reported in fragments in the soil at several points. Drilling with a hand drill has commenced near Nackawick Station to determine the commercial value of the find. A power drill will be used by the prospectors early this year, it is understood. The new mining prospect was announced yesterday by F. W. Pirie, Minister of Lands and Mines for New Brunswick.
