HEAVY LOAD BAN LIFTED ON GRAVEL ROADS YESTERDAY

The ban on loads in excess of 4,000 pounds, on gravel roads, which was applied on Monday due to the unseasonable rains, was officially lifted yesterday, it was stated by C. B. Croasdale, chief highway engineer.

As to the paved highways they are in perfect condition, it was stated. Although the removal of the snow by the heavy warm rains will make greater frost penetration, Mr. Croasdale stated that there is nothing to fear for their condition as careful drainage was used in the construction of the road to take care of such difficulties.

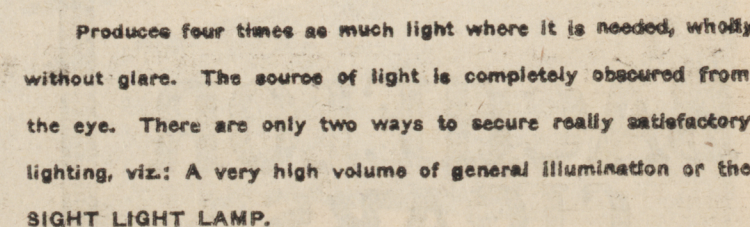
