

There are times when one is in-October 16, 1909, to realize that,

That was the hectic afternoon when rain and Geirge Mantha. the most amazing middleweight of all time-Stanley Ketchell-the Michigan Assassin, missed winning the championship of the world from the giant heavyweight king, Jack Johnson. by a matter of inches.

Ketchell was of Polish descent and a fighting tiger if ever there was one. His killer-fists catapulted through the ranks of all the leading welter and middleweight battlers of his day.

Was Dance Hall Bouncer Learning the gentle art of handling tough opponents in his capacity as a bouncer in a Butte, Montana, dance hall and saloon, he rose like a blast of flame to become a deity in the world of boxing fandom which paid homage to savage kayo fighters. Born in Grand Rapids, Mich., and

christened Stanislaus Kecal, he trav-

elled to Butte via the rods.

Ketchel was a glamorous figure of two prominent boxers who believe a glamorous era. His love for fierce physical combat was matched only by by the killing pace of the life he had mapped out - and he backed his chance to win with his sinews and his money. He was the kind who would stake all on the chance to land a finishing wallop.
