The prospect of saving from \$65,000,000 to \$70,000,000 a year by unified control was, in his opinion, a "hopeless proposition," Senator Dandurand said. All that the co-operative economies committee of the two railways had achieved under the 1932 and 1933 plans was a saving of \$1,900,000.
