DUNNING SAYS THAT PRESENT CONSTITUTION IS A BAR TO REFORM

Provinces in Way Exemption From Old Age Pension Contribution, He Tells House

OTTAWA, March 3—Plainly viewing the British North America Act as a barrier to social progress, Hon. Charles A. Dunning tonight looked forward to the time when the Federal Administration would have authority to enact far-reaching measures of reform, including a national scheme of old-age pensions from which the Provinces would be exempt from contributing.

STERN ORDERS TO KEEP DISCIPLINE IMPOSED ON STYRIAN NAZIS

GRAZ, Austria, March 2—Stern orders to maintain discipline were imposed on Styria's turbulent Nazis today by the Austrian minister of the interior, Arthur Seyss-Inquart. After conferring throughout the day with one group of Austrian Nazis after another, the minister, who is a friend of Chancellor Hitler of Germany, told interviewers he did not believe there would be a Nazi "putsch" or a march on Vienna.

Nazi leaders meanwhile made demands that Austria modify her relations with the Vatican. "I am not going to putch myself," Seyss-Inquart said. "On the contrary, I will demand that all National Socialists maintain the strictest discipline. I have found overwhelming enthusiasm in Styria province and I also know by now that my orders will be obeyed."
