Too much insistence upon good manners in young children may not only defeat its own object but also retard the normal development of personality, according to a joint statement, by the staff of the Child Study Association of America in the current issue of Child Study, the Association's monthly magazine. In the leading article the confusion results from failure of parents to distinguish between superficial forms of social behavior and the basic instincts of feeling for others which these forms are supposed to express. Good manners are certainly desirable, the article indicates, but are not all-important. The writers feel that the accepted forms in social relationships will come about naturally, or at least with unobtrusive prompting in a family atmosphere in which a sense of the worth and dignity of individuals prevails. Parents are advised, then, to think primarily about developing in their children genuine consideration of other people's feelings and interests.

The point is made that the young child who is forced to conform outwardly to standards of behavior beyond his inner growth may suffer serious damage to his personality. With very young children parents are advised to depend almost entirely on example and very little, if any, on moralizing.

"As the child grows older we explain the usual forms, with emphasis on the thought behind them, not just on the form," the statement continues. "And we can expect a little more thoughtfulness and self-denial, but it's easy to expect too much in the name of politeness."

"Especially in the relations of children to each other a great deal of crudeness seems to be essential to the process of social adjustment. Insisting on surface politeness may interfere with the genuine give and take by which children socialize each

other. It may be rude to quarrel and fight, but if one child gives in constantly to preserve peace it will not make for the sound development of either.

"Guests are entitled to special consideration; it is easy to carry this rule to a point which destroys the fun in having guests. To some extent we must take our cue from the children in guiding their relations to each other—leaving considerable leeway for behavior which might be offensive to an adult but which they seem to accept. The unkindness that children themselves resent are our legitimate point of attack."

"The child's behavior toward adults is in a different category. Most of us are willing to dispense with the extreme formality which marked adult-child relationships in the past, but some of us seem to have carried this trend to an extreme, allowing the child to feel that he is free to treat adults exactly as he treats his own friends. This is hardly a realistic attitude. Adults must, for the child's own good, retain the authority which is theirs by virtue of maturity and responsibility."

"No matter how kindly and understanding our discipline is, it rests, in the end, on authority—ideally an authority born of affection and respect rather than of fear. Recognizing that such respect is due us is essential to the child's whole adjustment, and his behavior toward us, while friendly and free, should reflect it."

"We can encourage free expression of opinion, open criticism and friendly joshing with adults. We can eliminate stultifying forms. But we can and must insist at the same time on essentially respectful behavior in the liberal, not the conventional, meaning of this old-fashioned word, unless we want to confuse the child and hamper his final adjustments to all authority."

HOSIERY COLOR AND LEG BEAUTY

With skirts shorter, if anything, you bring back into prominence one of your neatest assets, if your leg silhouette is attractive.

PARIS—Southward to Cannes turn Paris socialites when it starts getting below zero. There they go water-skiing, poloing, golfing, open-air dancing, yachting or day-long loafing.

Tip for Today

The title of this tip should be "Beauty and a Brush"—or rather six brushes—for no lovely lady should ever be without any of them. There's the hairbrush, of course, to keep your hair bright and shiny, and the tooth brush to give a lustre to those priceless pearls. A bath brush stirs up circulation and makes your body tingle; a special nail brush spells doom to the grime that collects round the knuckles and the tips. A complexion brush, if your skin isn't sensitive, helps to give you that coveted clear, rosy complexion, and a make-up brush adds a touch of professional perfection.

Be sure you keep these brushes scrupulously clean if you expect them to keep you in the pink of condition. Wash them regularly with soap and warm water, then tip them on the side to dry. This allows the water to drain off immediately, and thus prevents the possibility of soft, soggy bristles.

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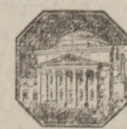
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
