

DRILLON CHASES N.H.L. SCORING TITLE

Former Moncton Junior Who Was Top Scorer In National League Last Year Sets Pace For Maple Leafs' 7-2 Win

Garnered Five Points With Two Markers And Three Assists — Brimsek Scores Seventh White wash — Other Games

TORONTO, Jan. 23. — Gordie Drillon, ace sniper of Toronto Maple Leafs, is out to repeat as the scoring champion of the National Hockey League, inactive for a month early in the season due to a broken thumb, the Moncton, N. B. boy is making up for lost time.

He emerged chief reaper of a scoreless harvest as the Leafs walloped New York Americans 7-2 here Saturday night. Bagging two goals himself, Gordie helped mates with three others, and boosted his season point total to 18, with 11 goals and seven assists.

In all the Leafs gained 20 points on the score sheet as they displayed much of the recklessness which marked the team as the league's top-scoring machine last season. Half of the total was aggregated by the starry Earl A. Apples — Drillon — Bob Davidson line. Apples scored once and gained three assists while Davidson also scored a goal.

Torrid Third Period

DETROIT, Jan. 23. — After two scoreless sessions, the league-leading Boston Bruins went on a five-goal rampage in the third period against Detroit Red Wings last night and gained a 5-0 shutout. Goalie Frank Brimsek's seventh of the National Hockey League season. A crowd of 11,657 saw the game.

The season has a while to go yet, and at the present rate Drillon should be up near the top of the goal-getters before the play-downs.

Trotter, a winger on the Red Wings is taking the shift voluntarily since the club needs a centerman more than a winger, and Gus Grieszrecht, starry centre for the hornets is coming up to the Wings. John Henry can look for the roof to fall in on him at Madison Square Garden shortly after the party gets under way at approximately 11 P. M. Atlantic Standard Time that evening. Joe in his final heavy workout before the fight went through 11 rounds of action, six against spar-mates, and wound up looking in as fine physical condition as at any time in his career.

After he polishes off John Henry — Joe thinks it's a cinch to wind up in a knockout. He wants another shot indoors before the winter season is over. From gossip around his camp, it seems possible Joe may meet Bob Pastor in March and there's a chance "Two-Ton" Tony Galento, the keg-shaped gent, may have a crack at it in June or July.

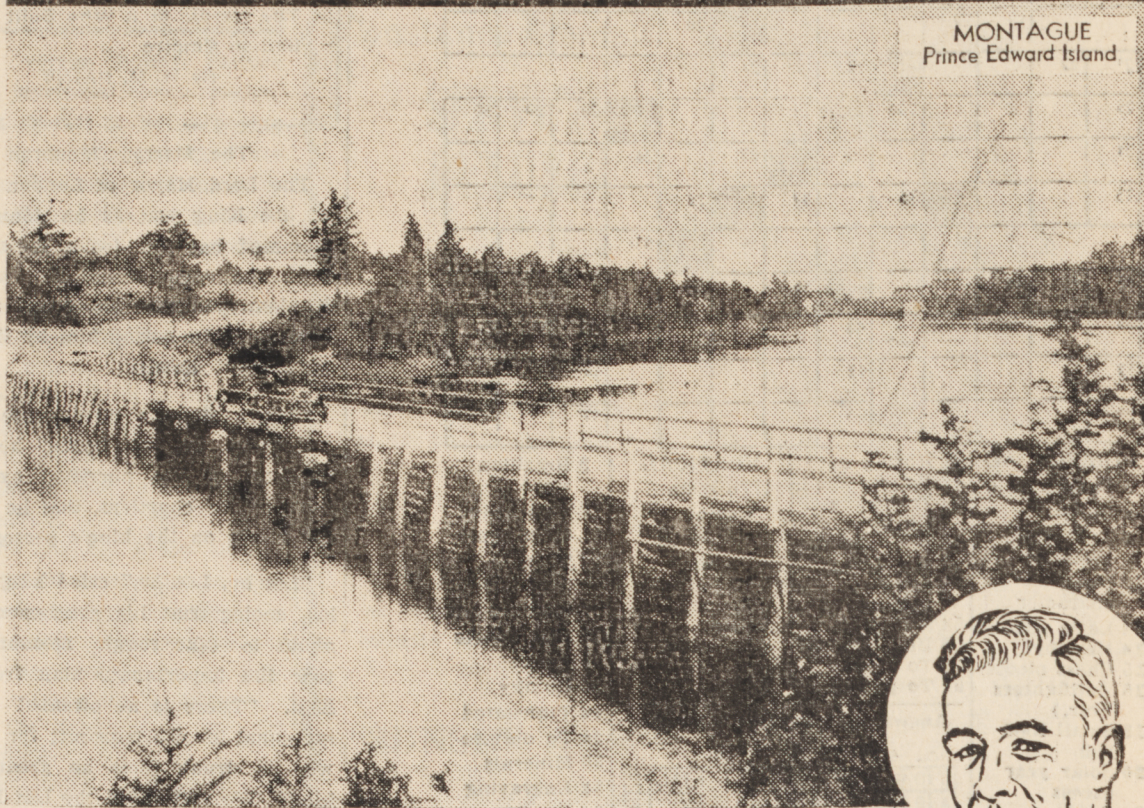

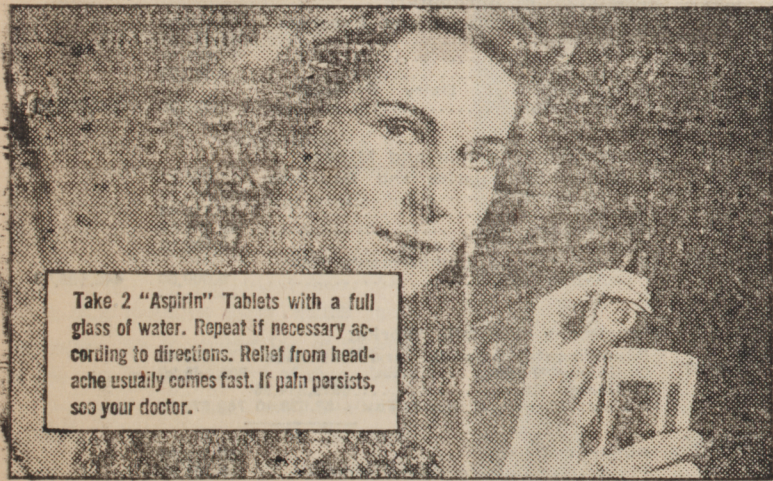

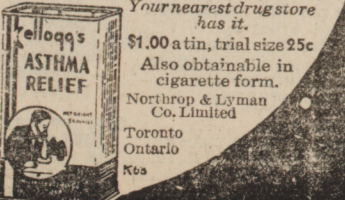
