pend not only on the movement at
very low rates of agricultural prod-
ucts of Western Canada but on the
ability of the producer to exchange
these for an adequate value of mer-
chandise which paid higher rates.
There was hope for some recovery
of grain prices above present low
levels.

"It may fairly be said that the un-
favorable returns of the past year do
not reflect any lack of efficiency or
enthusiasm on the part of the officers
and employees of your company," Sir
Edward emphasized. "In the year due
to a combination of circumstances
which is peculiar to the Canadian
situation. In common with other coun-
tries, Canada suffers from the dis-
turbed conditions due to interna-
tional, political and economic stresses."

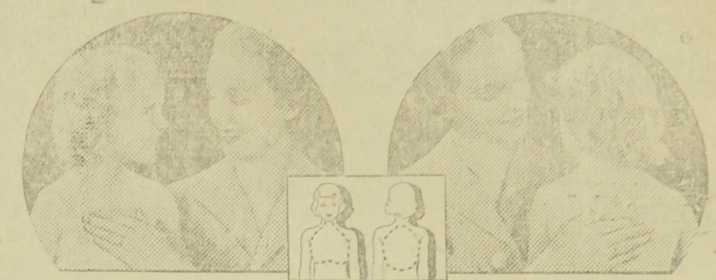

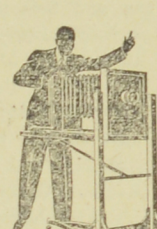
