Hughes prefaced his argument by
pointing out that the appeal court
findings had no effect as far as Wil-
lett was concerned because Willett
had had no opportunity to take the
stand in his own defence, and also
because he had merely been a wit-
ness, not a party to the suit.

Evidence at the February hearing
had shown he was not a man accus-
tomed to taking bribes, and was not
a perjurer, defence counsel said.
Hughes noted the magistrate's
good reputation and standing among
the citizens of Bathurst.

GERMAN AND ITALIAN PACT SIGNED IN JUNE

BERLIN, May 9.—The German-
Italian alliance will be signed at a
state function in Berlin in early
June, it was learned authoritatively
today. It is understood that Italian
heads of state will visit the German
capital at the time and make the
signing a state visit. It is not stated
who will represent Italy at the time.
In the meantime, Il Duce told Italians
in an address today that Italy is now
able to prove her strength to any
nation of the world and will be pre-
pared to do so when the hour comes.

Ald. Titus, chairman of the police
committee reported that Town Mar-
shal Wm. Wibberly had warned sev-
eral taxi drivers against further
speeding and that he had also been
called to quell a disturbance on Riv-
er Street. Ald. Pickard of the Welfare
committee reported seven families
had received assistance during the
month of April.

An extension on the discount period
in the hope of helping tax collections
was mooted. In effect this would
have provided a three per cent dis-
count on taxes paid during the next
thirty days. However, it was pointed
out by Mayor Long that such a course
would be contrary to a section in the
town Incorporation Act. The Town
Treasurer was authorized to meet
payment of a \$1000 bond maturing
June 1st with interest amounting to
\$427.50.
