Financial Bulletins
DOMINION OF CANADA ISSUE
Holders of \$115,202,500 Dominion of Canada bonds comprising four issues one of which matures June 1st, two on October 15th, and one on November 15th will have opportunity to convert their bonds into either of two maturities of 3 and 19 years. Cash-subscriptions of \$50-million will be invited. The new loan will take the form of 1½% bonds due May 15th 1942, priced at 99% plus accrued interest, to yield approximately 1.72% to maturity, and 3% bonds due June 1st 1948, priced at 98½% plus accrued interest, to yield approximately 3.10% to maturity. Both classes will be dated May 15th, 1939, the first to be non-callable to maturity, but the 3% bonds to be callable as a whole or in part on and after June 1st, 1963 on 60 days notice. Bonds accepted for conversion will be exchanged for interim certificates, and the resultant cash adjustment will be made in favour of the applicant on or after May 15th. Subscription lists will open Wednesday at all authorized dealers and at all branches of chartered banks, and will be subject to allotment.

ECONOMIC INDEX
During the week ended April 29th, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics Index stood at 106.0 vs 106.1 in the preceding week, and 113.2 a year ago.

CARLOADINGS
For the week ended April 29th, loadings totalled 46,740 cars against 44,066 cars in the previous week, and 14,509 cars a year ago, according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. From the previous week the increase was regarded as being of less than seasonal proportions.

AUTOMOBILE OUTPUT
Production during the current week showed a sharp decline according to Ward's Automotive Reports, which estimated current assembly totals at 71,420 units. This compared with 86,640 units last week and 53,286 units a year ago.

SUPPLY BROOMS TO ROYAL FAMILY
LONDON, May 10 — Throughout light British reigns the Bennet family have made stable brooms for the King—and for no one else.
The latest order went to Buckingham Palace last week. The first order went to George III.
An early Bennet was making brooms in his yard in a village near Brighton, when a man walked in and said to him:
"We want you to make brooms like that for Buckingham House. Can you?"
"Oh," said Mr. Bennett, "I don't think I could make them good enough for that."
"We think you can," said the man. "Will you?"
So he did.
He made them of heath (a kind of heather) and of heath his descendants made them right down until the war.
Mrs. Mary Anne Bennett, today's royal warrant holder, was in charge then.
"I simply couldn't get heath during the war. There were no men to gather it," Mrs. Bennett said.
"So I went to see the comptroller at Buckingham Palace. He was so nice. He came into the great big room where I was waiting and took both my hands in his. 'So you're the little lady who supplies our brooms,' he said.
"I told him I was and asked him if he would mind the brooms being made of birch instead of heath.
"He said no, as long as the brush was of the standard length. Now the royal household won't have anything but birch."
"I shall have to go to see Lord Cromer soon to ask him if it will be all right for me to pass the business on to a nephew as I haven't any sons."
"They used to order twenty dozen brooms about twice a year. Now it is ten dozen or six dozen. The biggest order I ever had were from King Edward VIII."

CONS. SMELTERS
Receipts of ore at the Trial smelter for the nine days ended April 30th, totalled 15,200 tons vs 15,918 tons in the comparable period a year ago. Cumulative receipts for the year to April 30th are reported at 186,260 tons vs 204,070 tons a year ago.

RITCHIE CUT STONE
For year ended March 31st, 1939, the Company shows a net loss after all charges, totalling \$17,207 vs a net loss in the previous year of \$17,127. Operating profit from mill production was \$69,805 against \$71,701 in 1937. Earned surplus shows at \$135,968 against \$142,620 in the previous year. Net working capital showed an improvement at \$91,677 vs \$76,737 at the end of the previous fiscal year, while investments are carried at market value of \$57,800 vs \$56,590 a year ago.

DOMINE MINES
Bullion production for the month of April totalled \$598,118 indicating an average recovery of \$11.80 per ton and comparing with output in the previous month of \$624,999 averaging \$11.93 per ton, and \$601,120 averaging \$12.00 per ton in the corresponding month a year ago.

PAYMASTER CONS
Bullion production in April totalled \$121,393 indicating an average recovery of \$7.34 per ton, and comparing with output at \$121,110 averaging \$7.07 per ton in the previous month.

ELECTROLUX CORP
Directors of Electrolux Corporation declared a dividend of 30c a share on 1,277,500 common shares outstanding, payable June 15th to shareholders of record May 15th. The previous declaration, payable March 15th, 1939, was 40c a share.

SHERWIN WILLIAMS CO
Declared a dividend of 1¼% per share on the preferred, payable July 3rd to shareholders of record June 15th.

CANADA & DOMINION SUGAR
Declared a dividend of 37½ per share, payable June 1st to shareholders of record May 15th.

BRITAIN HAS 200,000 WOMEN NOW ENROLLED
LONDON, May 10. — Uniforms continue to be the largest item on thousands of women's spring lists here. Nearly 200,000 women have already enrolled in the National Service organizations, all of them will eventually wear the special costume of their particular branch.
Ten thousand women have already enrolled to wear the drab tailored jackets and skirts of the Auxiliary Service, 127,000 have joined up to appear in the dark blue with red pipings and badges of the voluntary fire fighters and drivers, wardens or messengers of the Air Raid Precaution units and the matter of fact blue felt hats and blue overcoats of the St. John's Ambulances and similar outfits.
The Nursing Auxiliary Service already claims over 14,000 (100,000 are required) who will wear the grey cambric dresses, white organdy veils, and aprons with red crosses on the bibs—such as the V. A. D.'s wore in war time. The uniform for the Women's Land Army—now about 6,000, though 50,000 will be needed in an emergency—has not yet been decided. Smocks are the likely choice, and will probably be worn with breeches and high boots.
MOTOR TRANSPORT POPULAR
The most popular form of service among the younger women is that of motor transport. It is estimated about 40,000 drivers will be wanted. The London County Council alone requires more than 17,000 to aid with the evacuation of schools and the transport of supplies. Statemen's of needs from all over the country show that most local authorities want about 50 percent of their ambulance drivers to be women.
The Marchioness of Reading, head of the Women's Voluntary Services, praised the enthusiastic response of the women to the appeals for National Service in a statement to the Press:
"The importance of learning to do the job before an emergency arises is very great," she said. "I have been struck in going round the country by the considered response of women to the various appeals and by the awareness of women generally of the need to train in advance to fit themselves properly for work they may have to take up."




