experimental station are given exhaustive tests in the laboratory. Mr. McLeod said this morning that aphids are allowed to feed on diseased potatoes and are then placed on the new potatoes and allowed to feed and transmit the disease. Potatoes which develop the disease are discarded, while those which are resistant are tested over and over again to establish the certainty of their resistance. The seedlings are then turned over to the experimental farm again where they are tested for yield, shape, quality, and many other features to determine their commercial value.

In no case shall the security deposit be less than \$500.00.

oats and barley are seeded in Manitoba and in southern and central parts of the provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan the sowing of coarse grains varies from one to 75 per cent.

Warm weather has induced rapid germination and in Manitoba especially, wheat of the early varieties is reported above ground.

Precipitation is estimated much below normal since the beginning of April and heavy rains are hoped for.

Northern Alberta reports 21,500 acres in sugar beets as compared with 19,500 last year, with 80 per cent seeded to date.

Grass is showing good growth and consequent good feed prospects for livestock. South-eastern Saskatchewan sends word of grasshoppers in the hatching-out stage.

Peace River keeps pace with seeding operations of last season, having 60 per cent in the ground already in wheat and 10 to 60 per cent of oats in some areas, notably Grande Prairie and west. Winds are drying the soil and farmers hope for rain.

Stone fruits in British Columbia are in full bloom, though in some districts earlier maturing cherries are already setting well. The apple country is a picture of bloom which points to full crop with satisfactory weather. First E. C. strawberries will move from the lower mainland district late in May, according to present indications.

upon all applications for seed. Assistance for the purchase of seed shall be for the present season only and shall be granted only to bona fide farmers and shall be given on the basis of actual need, and all applications must be dealt with on a strictly non-partisan basis.

(3) Total amount of seed to be distributed in any municipality shall be at the discretion of the Minister of Agriculture, and such assistance shall not exceed forty-five dollars (\$45.00) for any one farmer or for any one farm.

(4) In no case shall the quantity of seed obtainable by any one farmer or for any one farm be in excess of the following:

Potatoes, 4 barrels; oats, 24 bushels; wheat, 3 bushels; buckwheat, 3 bushels; timothy, 80 pounds.

(5) All seed shall be purchased by the municipality and wherever possible shall be obtained within the municipality.

(6) Where seed cannot be obtained within the municipality the Department of Agriculture will cooperate with the municipality in placing orders for seed to meet the requirements.

(7) Any farmer obtaining assistance shall give to the municipality his promissory note payable in six months with interest at five per cent (5%) per annum with an endorser or endorsers satisfactory to the municipality.

(8) Where necessary the Province will lend its assistance to the municipality to obtain bank credit to finance such loans.

(9) Should any losses result from such loans the same shall be borne one-third by the municipality and two thirds by the Province, settlement to be based on the accounts outstanding and unpaid on the 31st day of October, 1940, provided nevertheless that the municipality shall account for, and pay to the Province two thirds of, any monies collected by it on such accounts after the last mentioned date.
