### COSTLY CARELESSNESS

A. Cyril Daldy of St. Louis, Mo., sends us another interesting hand. He writes: "Recently I watched a hand which seems interesting by reason of its apparent simplicity. Actually, it was not quite so simple as it seemed and it left me with an uncomfortable feeling that I, also, would have lost the contract by playing in the same careless way as the actual Declarer."

"South won the opening club lead" Mr. Daldy says, "and noted that if the trumps were divided no worse than 4-2, he had but one apparent loser in spades and two in clubs. Confidently he led the spade ten, on which East played the Ace. But after the defenders had cashed two club tricks, West led the thirteenth card of that suit. East ruffed with his otherwise useless nine of spades and Declarer was down one, for when he overtrumped, West's eight of spades was good for the setting trick."

"After taking the first club trick, Declarer could just as easily have played a heart to dummy's Ace and

taken the simple safety measure of leading towards his trump sequence instead of away from it. Against this slightly better play no defence would have set the hand."

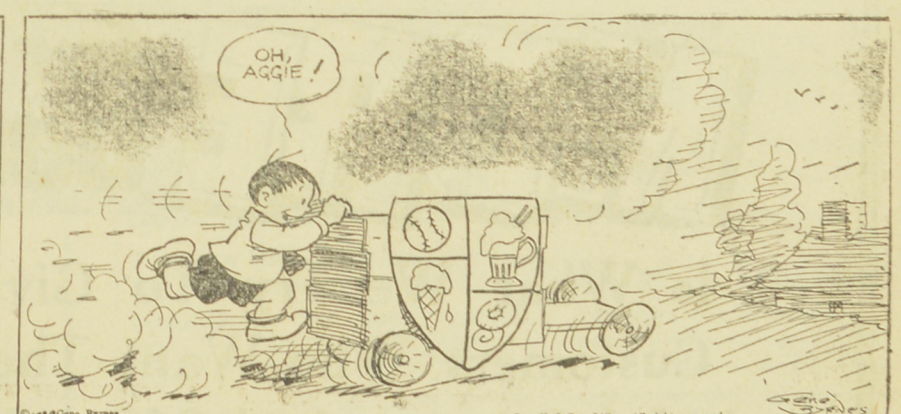
