If the steel is flawless no trace remains when the powder is dusted off. When present, surface cracks too minute for detection by a powerful magnifying glass or faults bidden in the interior are reveal-ed by a tell-take trail of powder

electrical current. Presence of such a flaw causes the immediate rejection of the part. This new method of flaw detection is part of a comprehensive policy of safety measures for the protection of the travelling public.
