

Financial Bulletins

PICKLE CROW
For the three months ended March 31st, 1939, bullion production totalled \$691,936 averaging \$22.06 per ton and comparing with output in the preceding quarter of \$703,240 with an average of \$23.11 per ton. In the initial quarter of 1938 bullion production totalled \$677,571 the average recovery per ton being \$23.75.

SISCOE GOLD
For the three months ended March 31st, the Company reports a net profit of \$194,988, equal to 4.2c on each of the 4,640,063 shares outstanding. This compares with a profit of \$289,056 or 6.2c per share in the initial 1938 quarter. Costs per ton milled were shown at \$4.62 as compared with costs of \$4.79 a year ago.

SHAWINIGAN
The Company declared the regular quarterly dividend of 22c a share, payable May 15th to shareholders of record April 26th.

COSMOS IMPERIAL MILLS
Declared the regular quarterly dividend of 25c on the common stock, payable May 15th to shareholders of record April 29th and \$1.25 per share on the preferred payable July 15th to shareholders of record June 30th.

Net operating revenue for the three months ended March 31st, 1939, is reported at \$2,951,987 against \$2,035,076 for the like 1938 period. Fixed charges absorbed \$940,851, leaving a net income, subject to depreciation and income tax of \$1,111,136 as compared with \$1,045,796.

CANADIAN LIGHT
For the year ended December 31st, 1938, the Company reports a net profit, subject to income tax, of \$41,236 or \$1.24 per share as compared with \$40,652 or \$1.22 per share in 1937. Gross income for the year is shown of \$422,830 and compares with \$418,610 in 1937. Working capital during 1938 shows a sharp increase to \$75,033 as compared with \$35,566 at the close of the preceding year.

DOMINE MINES
For the quarter ended March 31st, the Company reports an estimated profit of \$1,934,437 before depreciation, depletion and adjustments of surplus and contingent reserve. This compares with a profit in the corresponding period last year of \$1,097,776. Bullion production for the period amounted to \$1,824,737 from the milling of 151,300 tons indicating an average recovery per ton of \$12.06. This compares with output in the initial quarter of 1938 of \$1,845,153 from 147,400 tons averaging \$12.52 per ton.

WHAT TO DO WITH SEPTIC TANKS, CESSPOOLS

Here is problem which often stumps those living in the country—"What to do to increase the disposal capacity of septic tanks and cesspools."

The efficient operation of a tank or pool depends primarily upon the absorption of liquid by the soil. In sandy soils, it is usually easy to dispose of fluid, but stiff clay soil often makes disposal difficult because the soil absorbs moisture slowly.

One answer to this problem is blasting with dynamite. The procedure is simple and involves little cost or labor.

For new tanks, before the tile is laid, small charges of dynamite should be exploded at a depth of about six feet below the level of the tile line. One-stick charges should be placed eight feet apart, and the electric method of firing is recommended. The blast will shatter the subsoil and make it more porous.

Septic tanks which have been in use for a long time, and have dropped in capacity, have been made more efficient through subsoil blasting. This work can be done by putting down holes to a depth of several feet below the level of the tile line. They should be sunk at intervals of

CANADIAN EXPORTS
For the month of March, the value of domestic exports totalled \$74,149,000 vs \$61,727,000 in the previous month, and \$74,219,000 in March, 1938, according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. For the fiscal year ended March 31st, domestic exports aggregated \$926,962,966 vs \$1,070,229,000 in the previous year.

ELECTRIC OUTPUT
For the week ended April 15th, production in the United States totalled 2,170,671,000 k.w.h., an increase of 10.9% over the like 1938 week. Output in the previous week at 2,173,510,000 k.w.h. constituted an increase of 9.2% over the corresponding 1938 week.

CONS. SMELTERS
For the week ended April 14th, ore receipts at the Trail smelter totalled 159,670 tons as compared with receipts of 177,353 tons for the corresponding week last year.

CANADIAN AIRWAYS
In the report covering operations during 1938, the Company shows a net loss of \$213,501 after all charges. This compares with a net loss in the previous year of \$30,432. Operating revenues for the year totalled \$1,024,675 against \$1,137,184 a year earlier. The balance sheet discloses current assets of \$356,349 against liabilities of \$501,957, compared with current assets in the previous year of \$434,475 against current liabilities of \$423,536.

CANADIAN CELANESE
It was stated at the annual meeting held yesterday that earnings for the first quarter were equivalent to 60% per share on the common stock, compared with 15c per share in the same quarter last year. Plants of the Company are now operating 95 to 100% of capacity.

SIGMA MINES
Net profit in March amounted to \$48,687 after taxes and deferred development, compared with \$43,771 in the preceding month. In the first quarter of the current year, net profit was shown of \$144,560 as compared with \$109,644 for the similar 1938 quarter. Bullion production in March amounted to \$160,051 from the milling of 21,107 tons, an average recovery of \$7.58 per ton, and comparing with output in February of \$143,476 from 18,926 tons averaging \$7.58. Operating charges in March totalled \$4.06 per ton against \$3.93 in February.

eight feet and at a distance of six to eight feet from the tile line and on both sides of it. Each hole should be loaded with a single stick of dynamite. The surrounding subsoil will be loosened and absorption increased.


In much the same way, the drainage of cesspools can be improved by subsoil blasting. After a pool has been dug and lined with brick or stone, single sticks of dynamite should be loaded in holes in a circle eight to ten feet from the edge and three to four feet below the bottom of the pool. The charges should be spaced about eight feet apart, and in this case also, the electric method of firing is recommended because it is safer. Pools have often shown double the usual drainage capacity after the subsoil has been blasted.

A pool which has been in use for some time is likely to lose capacity. This may be true where a gravel soil contains some clay. This condition has been remedied by emptying the pool and blasting the subsoil in this manner.

A single charge of one or two sticks of 40 per cent ammonia dynamite is loaded in a hole in the center of the pool and four or more feet below its bottom. An electric blasting cap should be used to detonate this charge.

It is important in all types of blasting to tamp the bore holes with earth after loading, unless the holes are filled with water. Fuses, or leading wires from electric blasting machines must be long enough to permit blasters and others to take a safe distance before blasts. This precaution should be taken even though a single-stick charge of dynamite is hardly likely to disturb the surface of the ground when loaded to the depths already described.
