## COMMODITY PRICES:

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics reports that its wholesale commodity price index rose to 73.3 in the week ended March 31st from 73.2 in the previous week. For the corresponding week last year the index stood at 86.9.

## CRUDE OIL:

According to the U. S. Bureau of Mines, stocks of crude petroleum as at March 25th, totalled 273,915,000 bbls, an increase of 570,000 bbls over the previous week.

## B. C. PULP &amp; PAPER:

Holders of the 6% First Mortgage Sinking Fund Bonds will be asked to sanction the postponement of the semi-annual installments of interest represented by coupons maturing on May 1st and November 1st, 1939, and May 1st and November 1st, 1940, such installments to be paid, with interest thereon at 6% per annum, on November 1st, 1942, or prior thereto, at the Company's option. This proposal will be submitted to bondholders at a special meeting to be held May 1st. It is also proposed to waive and cancel the payments in cash or bonds to the Sinking Fund which will fall due in the year 1939-40-41 and 42.

British World's Fair  
Exhibit Will Demonstrate  
Anglo-American Relations

NEW YORK, April 13 — Great Britain's 150,000 square-foot exhibit at the New York World's Fair will attempt to demonstrate by 10 centuries of historical exhibits, including one showing that George Washington is a direct descendant of King John who signed the Magna Charta that the British Empire and the United States spring from the same roots and share the same "common purpose," Sir Louis Beale, British Commissioner General of the fair, said yesterday on a preview tour.

The British pavilion stands on the shore of the Lagoon of Nations, commanding a full-length view of Constitutional Mall, the main street of the fair which stretches from the lagoon to the Trylon and Perisphere. The buildings of the British exhibit have been erected but extensive decorating and furnishing will be completed by the opening date of the fair, April 30, Sir Louis said.

Separate pavilions will be operated by the Dominion of Canada, and Erie, Australia, New Zealand, The British

tract will involve a minimum of about 700,000 tons of structural steel, it is stated.

## SUDBURY BASIN

For the year ended December 31st, 1938, the Company reports a net profit of \$219,931, equal to 13c per share on the 1,689,505 shares outstanding. This compares with a net profit in the previous year of \$315,196, or 18c per share. Total income for the year is shown as \$511,241 against \$614,526. After all charges, the net of \$219,931 was carried forward to profit and loss account, which now shows at \$412,921.

Although no dividends were disbursed during 1938, it was stated that it was hoped that financial conditions will permit a small dividend payment in July, 1939, and with the La Luz Mine well into production, increased dividends should be in sight for 1940.

## SULLIVAN CONS

Gold production for the first three months of the current year totalled \$247,840. This compares with \$232,821 in the preceding quarter, and \$181,268 in the first quarter a year ago. Tonnage figures are not yet available.

## CENTRAL CADILLAC

At a special meeting held yesterday, shareholders of the Company approved sale of the assets to a new company, to be known as Central Cadillac Mines Limited, to facilitate further financing. The new company will have an authorized capitalization of 4-million \$1. par value shares, in place of the present 3-million share capitalization. Stockholders will be issued shares on a share-for-share basis. The financing agreement calls for the sale on a firm basis of 375,000 shares at 20c per share, providing

The British pavilion will carry across its facade the statement "this pavilion is dedicated to the lasting friendship between the people of the United States and the British Empire," he said.

CHANGING MAP  
CAUSES OFFICIALS  
BIG HEADACHE

WASHINGTON, April, 13 — The United States Post Office Department faces the prospect of ripping up its \$20,000 foyer floor or ignoring what's been happening abroad. Centerpiece of the departmental building—one of the costliest in the capital—is a huge floor map of the world, built out of colored stone. But since Italy's Ethiopian and Albanian campaigns and Germany's annexation of Austria and Czechoslovakia the map is pretty inaccurate. Officials are afraid to order alternations, because another country might go before the new cement is dry.

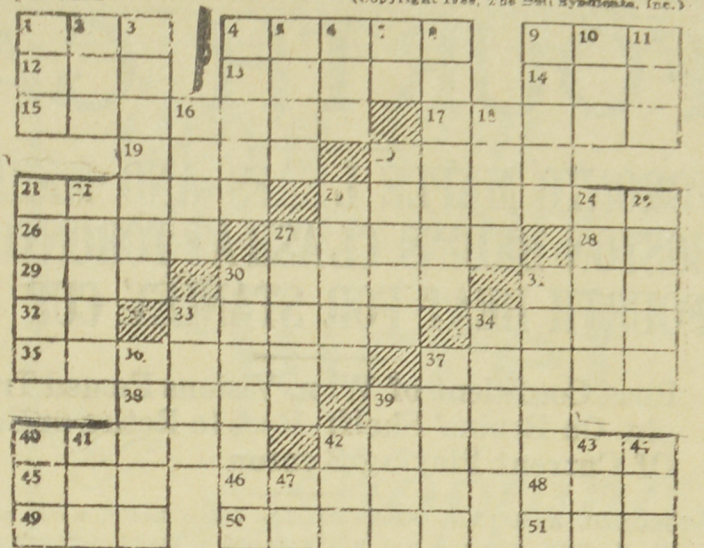
