3 Convictions Are Upheld In Racehorse Drugging

CINCINNATI, Nov. 19-Prison sentences and fines of three men convicted of violating narcotic laws in the drugging of a race-horse were upheld recently by the U. S. Circuit Court of Ap-

The men are Joe F. Patterson, of the Audrey Farm Stables, fined \$1,000 and sentenced to six months in the Milan, Mich., detention farm; Robert Wingfield, Latoni, Ky., \$250 and six months and Horace Moore, Covington, \$500 and six months.

All were convicted by a jury in the United States District Court at Detroit and sentenced July 28, 1934. Patterson, it was charged, caused narcotics to be delivered to the State Fair Grounds, Detroit, September 1, 1933. All were implicated in the drugging of Knight's Gal Octob-
