

SUDDEN DEATH FROM HEART ATTACK IN BARN

George D. Howland, 81-Year-Old Lincoln Man Passes Suddenly

Funeral Sunday
Deceased Well Known and Highly Respected In Community

Death came suddenly yesterday afternoon to Geo. D. Howland, aged 81, well known Lincoln resident, who succumbed to a heart attack in the barn owned by his nephew. He had only arrived two hours previously to pay a visit to his nephew, who is Manzer Howland of Harris Bridge. The elderly man had not been ill before that time.

He was very well known and highly regarded by everybody and he was a member of the Lincoln Lodge, L. O. L. No. 35. Surviving is one brother, William Howland, also several nieces and nephews.

The funeral will take place on Sunday afternoon from the home of his nephew, Manzer Howland, of Harris Bridge with prayers at one o'clock followed by service at the Baptist church at Oromocto. Rev. Mr. Ricker will conduct and interment will be made in the Court House cemetery at Burton. The funeral will be under the auspices of the Lincoln Lodge L. O. L. No. 35.

BIG MARKET TODAY

Today's market at Phoenix Square was a large one with many farmers in. The weather being mild probably accounted for the increased number of farmers arriving for the week-end market. Prices were practically unchanged from the last several weeks though chickens sold for slightly higher price. Chicken sold for 28 to 30 cents per pound. Eggs remained steady at 25 cents per dozen. In one corner of the market a farmer was selling clams for 20 cents; scallops 35 cents; and oysters, 45 cents. The other prices were as follows: Butter 25 cents per pound; wood, \$2 to \$8 per cord; potatoes, 75 cents per barrel; pork, 10 to 14 cents per pound; beef, 4 to 6 cents per pound; lamb, 14 to 16 cents per pound.

HISTORY OF LAW SYSTEM BY SPEAKER

C. R. Hawkins Delivers Fine Address to Science Club Gathering

First Judicial System
An Interesting Meeting Held at the Home of S. S. Miler

The Fredericton Science Club met last evening at the residence of S. S. Miler, 140 York Street, Mrs. Miler being assisted in her duties as hostess by Mrs. F. P. Lister, and Mrs. A. E. Mathewson. About 20 members and guests were present.

The minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved and the name of Maynard P. Harrison was voted on and added to the club membership. The president, acting as chairman, introduced the speaker of the evening, C. R. Hawkins, who gave the club a very clear and illuminating address on "Our Judicial System".

Mr. Hawkins introduced his subject by a sketch enumeration of the things he was leaving out and depicted our first judicial system as the sword and battle-axe, superseded, after the Norman conquest, by the King in person, the system of courts being started by the signing of the Magna Charta. It has developed to its present smooth-running and well articulated plan of the King's Bench, dealing with crimes and litigation, and the Chancery Court which deals with titles of land, taxation, estate matters and adoption. The Appeal Court is a third branch which can overrule or sustain decisions of either of these.

Below these in jurisdiction are the County Courts, and still inferior is the foundation on which the whole system is built, the Inferior Courts such as Police Magistrate's Courts, Justice-of-the-Peace's Courts and others, which deal with the great mass of minor crimes and disagreements.

Appeal may be made from the Provincial Appeal Court to the Appeal Court of Canada, and to the Privy Council, direct or as a final appeal from the Appeal Court of Canada.

The speaker paid a strong tribute to the excellent work done in simplifying the administration of justice by the Inferior Courts.

After a short period of discussion and a short musical treat, furnished by Mrs. John Webster, and Mrs. F. P. Lister, delicious refreshments were served and the meeting broke up.

Mr. Hawkins' address was given in his usual interesting style and was one of the best heard this season.


