THE CHAIN LETTER MENACE

One of the most astonishing features of modern culture is that it has not yet succeeded in eliminating some of the grossest forms of superstition worthy of the Middle Ages. Among them is the belief that in the "get rich quick" theory, as manifested in the amazing extent of popular credulity over the latest form of racketeering—the so-called chain letter scheme.

This has now invaded Canada and there is plenty of evidence that it is spreading rapidly here. One would have thought that the average Canadian had too much hard common-sense and was too sound a business man to even give such stupid ideas any consideration. But unfortunately this does not appear to be the case. There is not wanting proof that a surprisingly large number of people have allowed their superstitious instincts to override—temporarily only, we hope—their better judgment.

Of course, the whole thing is nothing less than an elaborate racket, in which hundreds of thousands of deluded people are being fleeced in order that the schemers may profit by their foolishness. It is just as essential today to protect the fool from the consequences of his folly as it was a century ago. Great Britain has already set the example by prosecuting and fining promoters of a snowball chain letter scheme there. It may be necessary to do the same thing here. If so, there should be no hesitation. It is in the highest degree desirable that all such sneaking tricks for the deliberate ensnaring of the public should be put down with a firm hand.

WAR WITH MANKIND

One of Washington's greatest problems today, according to Drew Pearson and Robert S. Allen, Washington columnists, is the starlings. "Imported from England in 1890 to kill insects, the starlings have singled out the capital of the United States as their most popular winter roosting place along the Atlantic seaboard," they report in Cosmopolitan.

"By hundreds of thousands they crowd the trees, the eaves, the broad ledges of government buildings, challenging the ingenuity of the district commissioners to remove them.

"The fire department was the first

weapon of attack. The starlings evacuated until the firemen had ceased deluging their roosts with water, then flew back again. They seem to enjoy the game. But the humane societies protested.

Finally they resorted to balloons! Three or four balloons are tied to a string long enough to reach the ledge on which the intended victims roost. A starling-chaser then walks on the ground below the ledge, the balloons travelling parallel to the ledge above him.

Protesting raucously this intrusion, the birds desert the ledge and head for neighboring trees. But here they are welcomed by an army of unemployed, paid 30 cents an hour and armed with tin cans full of stones tied to the end of long poles which they shake vigorously. It is a great game, with the odds in favor of the starlings."

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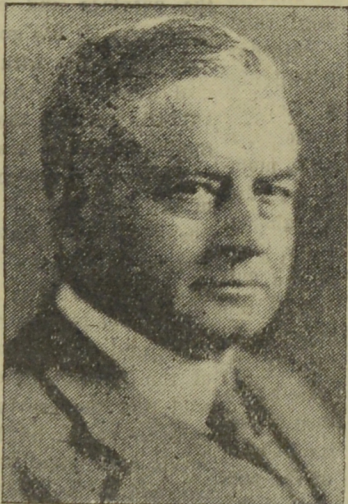
