RABBI APPEALS TO POPE

TO LEAD PEACE CRUSADE

CLEVELAND, Oct. 8.—Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner, in his Atonement Day address, said he hoped Pope Pius XI would see fit to lead the religious forces of the world in a crusade for world peace.

"Whether or not the diplomats want war, it is certain that the common people want peace," said Dr. Brickner. "Peace they can have if they will rise up and in one mighty voice demand that Mussolini stop. No dictator, no matter how drunk with imperialistic ambition, will dare to carry on his deadly program of war in the face of the world's opposition to it," Dr. Brickner said.

"I hope that the Pope will see fit to lead the religious forces of the world in this crusade for world peace."
