### Live In Louisiana

Have Many Friends In

Word has been received here from Louisiana that J. H. Cassidy and Edward Cassidy of that state will arrive in Fredericton within the next week or so and will make their headquarters for some days at the Barker House. J. H. Cassidy, who is at the present time president of the First State Bank and Trust Company of Bogalusa, Louisiana, left Fredericton with his brother in 1886. The family moved to Pennsylvania, where they continued to reside for some time. In 1906 the two Cassidy brothers, J. H. and Edward, moved to Louisiana, where they have prospered.

J. H. Cassidy visited here in 1890 and again in 1907. They expect to arrive here on July 12 or 15 and would like to get in touch with as many old friends as possible and will be glad to have their friends call on them at the Barker House. The late William Murphy who resided on King Street was cousin of the Cassidy boys, as is also Michael Murphy, who lives on King Street at the present time. Mason, of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons, Toronto, on simplified gold inlay technique.

## WISH BETTER UNDERSTANDING REGULATIONS

Farmers In This Area  
Meet Dairy Products  
Commission

### Dairy Owner Present

Commission Considers  
Final Phase Of  
Regulations

A delegation of farmers from the Fredericton area who supply milk to the local dairies, as well as the manager of the General Dairies, Ltd., William Johnston, met with the New Brunswick Dairy Products' Commission here this morning for the purpose of discussing the situation in this area.

H. N. Flewelling of Sussex, secretary of the Commission, said today that the meeting here is to get a better understanding of the regulations which will come into effect on July 15 in this area, as well as other areas in the province. The meeting is being continued this afternoon with the following members of the Commission present: Dr. L. A. Donovan, St. John; chairman; A. D. Freeze, of Penobscot; K. W. Milner of Moncton, and H. N. Flewelling, of Sussex, the secretary.

The New Brunswick Dairy Products' Commission held a short meeting here yesterday and dealt with details concerning the enforcement of regulations in those areas where they be-

## TILLEY CABINET HOLDS FINAL MEETING TONIGHT

Premier - Elect Dysart  
Awaits Resignation of  
Premier Tilley

### New Leader Here

Conference With Road  
Experts Continue To-  
day In The Capital

Premier L. P. D. Tilley and his Cabinet will hold their final meeting here this evening, commencing at eight o'clock. Subsequently Premier Tilley and his cabinet are expected to resign and administrative power transferred to the hands of Premier-elect A. A. Dysart, following the dictates of the recent election in New Brunswick.

Hon. Mr. Dysart is in the city today and together with J. B. McNair, of this city, president of the N. B. Liberal Association, conferred with "certain road experts" in connection with temporary halt of highway contract work in the province which has been called by Premier-elect Dysart. No announcement was made today regarding the conference although it is expected that the conference will last all day.

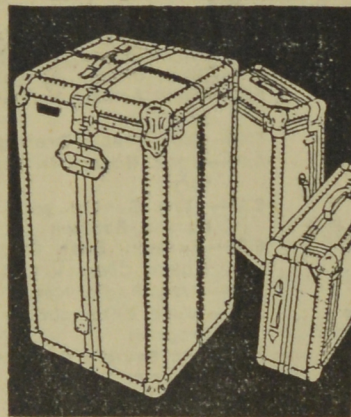
