## VINCENT MASSEY SOON TO GET LONDON POST

OTTAWA, Oct. 31.—Hon. G. Howard Ferguson, Canadian High Commissioner in London since 1930, will shortly return to Canada, making way for the appointment of Hon. Vincent Massey of Toronto, President of the National Liberal Association, in his stead.

### Ready to Resign

It is understood the former Ontario Premier has intimated he is ready to resign whenever it is convenient for the new Government to relieve him. Mr. Massey's reappointment to London may be expected during the present week. He was on his way to the Empire's Capital in August, 1930, when the accession of the Bennett Government interfered with the plans to send him there.

Mr. Massey's major assignment during the next few months doubtless will be the conduct of negotiations with the British Government for a broadening and deepening of the channels of British-Canadian trade. The new Government is committed to an extension of the British preference and extension of trade within the Empire.

Prime Minister Mackenzie King believes this can best be brought about by adopting the plan of Prime Minister Stanley Baldwin for a lowering of tariff barriers within the Commonwealth rather than by a heightening of barriers against foreign countries.

### Tariff Cut Likely

While an Imperial Conference is likely to be held in London within the next twelve months, it would not be

surprising if the Budget to be introduced in the Canadian Commons next spring provides for return to the tariff basis which prevailed after the Dunning Budget of 1930, and before the emergency session of Parliament summoned by Mr. Bennett raised duties to the highest level in Canadian history. Premier King has conferred with Sir Francis Floud, High Commissioner in Canada for the United Kingdom.

During the week it is believed there will be a thorough canvass by the Minister of Finance, Hon. Charles Dunning, of trade and tariff matters, particularly those affecting relations with the United States.

There will be no interruption, it is understood, in the important investigations undertaken some months ago by the Tariff Board. Public hearings will be held here in November.

## WILD GEESE ELUDE DEATH IN NIAGARA

NIAGARA FALLS, New York, Oct. 31.—Thousands of Arctic wild geese yesterday eluded an apparent death trap that held them on the upper Niagara river for 24 hours and flew away on their annual southward migration.

They left behind home 200 of their number, victims either of the mighty Niagara Falls or the guns of hunters.

The geese, estimated at 10,000, were trapped yesterday when granders, leading their flight from the Arctic to the Carolinas unsuspectingly brought their followers to rest on the treacherous currents of the upper river.

## QUINTUPLETS CRY FOR MEAT, ADDED TO 17 MONTHS DIET

CALLANDER, Ont., Oct. 31.—The Dionne quintuplets, 17 months old, added meat to their diet for the first time.

It's only a small quantity of carefully selected and prepared veal liver served once a week, but it marked the youngsters' first move toward a grown-up diet.

The liver and Marie's development were high lights of the famous babies' 17th month. Marie has progressed remarkably mentally and physically in the last four weeks, Dr. Allen Roy Dufos, their physician said.

Within a few months, Marie, who was the smallest of the five when they were born May 28, 1934, and has lagged since, will equal her sisters in every way, the physician believes.

Their main diet consists of vegetables, prepared in several ways, fruit bread and butter, and milk—plenty of the latter, Dr. Dufos emphasizes.

## HOOVER BIBLE VALUED \$50,000 ON MARKET

HARTFORD, Oct. 31.—The famous Bible of the Rev. Thomas Hooker, founder of Hartford and inspirer of Connecticut's first government, which has been handed down from father to son for eight generations, may be sold to assure its preservation as a historical relic.

The book, valued at between \$250,000 and \$500,000, now is possessed by Edward Eugene Hooker, Jr., 71, Mt. Pocono, Pa., and his sister Mary, 76, the last descendants in the militant leader who led a band of 100 settlers here in June, 1836, from Cambridge, Mass., to set up the first church in Connecticut.

Except for the title page, portions of exodus and all of genesis, which were missed after the Bible was loaned for an exhibit many years ago, the book is intact.

## THE NEW CABINET
