The following are the recipes for the exhibits which were awarded honorable mention in The Daily Mail Cooking Contest in last Wednesday's judging, which took place at the Maritime Electric Co., Ltd., store:

Small Cakes

Sift flour, Swansdown or pastry, 1 2/3 cup.
1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder. Sift together three times.
Cream 1/3 cup butter
1 cup sugar
Add 2 unbeaten eggs, one at a time, beat after each one.
Add flour alternately with 1/2 cup milk.
Beat until smooth, add 1 teaspoon flavoring. Bake in cup cake pan 15 to 20 minutes.

Frosting

1 cup granulated sugar
4 tablespoons boiling water. Let boil until brittle in cold water.
Pour slowly into white of egg well beaten, beat until cool, flavor. Spread on top of cakes.

Ginger Snaps

1 cup shortening
1 cup molasses
1 cup brown sugar
2 teaspoons ginger
2 teaspoons soda, dissolved in little warm water
Salt
Flour to roll out.
Boil shortening and molasses together, for a few minutes. Let cool till just lukewarm. Then add brown sugar and rest of ingredients.

TABLE DECORATION

For the winter bouquet, the things near at hand are lovely. What have you in your yard or in the woods nearby? Walk out and look. You will doubtless find some pretty grasses, shrubs with berries on them, bitter-sweet vines, the ground pine which trails along the ground, evergreen branches, or even the bare twigs of small trees.

For the dining table, select scraggly, wide-sprawling branches, cut the stems rather short and arrange them artistically in a flat dish, with a flower holder to make them stand up. If you are using evergreen branches, put sand in the dish, keep it moist, and the needles will not fall off for a long time.

For an autumn festival, fill a pumpkin with figs, nuts and dates, or assemble an assortment of fruits or vegetables. A cornucopia or horn of plenty, may be made with cardboard, covered with yellow crepe paper and laid on one side, with fruits and vegetables spilling abundantly from the open end.

WINDOWS

Every house should have enough windows to furnish ventilation and light, but too many windows make a glare and chill a room, in cold weather. Architects tell us that the window area of a room should not be less than one-fifth, nor more than one-fourth of the floor area. If a room has too few windows, an additional one may be cut. Window space, use dark curtains and dark wall finishes to absorb the excess light, that it may not make a trying glare.

Windows should be made tight against the weather to save heat and to prevent rattling, so saving the nerves of the residents. They should open and close easily and be provided with tight fitting screens. Bedrooms and the kitchen need to have windows on two outside walls, to furnish ample ventilation.
