

## OUTBREAK OF CUTWORMS IS GENERAL IN N.B.

Agriculturists are Taking Precaution Against Various Species

### How To Fight Them

Severe Injury has Occurred to Crops from the Cutworm Menace

The likelihood of a general outbreak of cutworms was foretold in warnings issued to agriculturists and the press of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island in April 1935. Severe injury has occurred and present indications are that it may be continued in 1936. Several different species are concerned—the black army cutworms occurred in destructive numbers in portions of Gloucester county; the bronze cutworm in Westmorland county on the dyked meadows; the variegated cutworm in greenhouses and cold-frames; while field and garden crops have been severely injured by the striped cutworm, and the W-marked cutworm. The black cutworm and the glassy cutworm have also been noted in some what greater abundance than usual. There is the possibility that two more may appear in August, the true armyworm attacking corn, grain and grass in August, and the corn ear worm feeding upon the silk and kernels of corn. This last named insect is not known to pass the winter in New Brunswick but outbreaks occur from time to time, believed to originate in flights of moths from the south.

No outbreak of the true armyworm has occurred in New Brunswick since August 1914, but observations have shown the insect to be slowly increasing in abundance from year to year. If such an outbreak does develop it may be expected on the interval lands along the St. John and Kennebecasis rivers and on the islands in the St. John river where it occurred twenty-one years ago.

In a general way, all which move about over the surface of the ground at night will eat a poisoned bran bait, the formula recommended being: bran 20 lbs., Paris Green, ½ lb., molasses, one quart, and water to moisten the bran thoroughly. The Paris Green should be mixed with the dry bran and the molasses with the water. Large cutworms move about more

## VICE-REGAL PARTY ON FAREWELL VISIT HERE TODAY, A WELCOME BY THE CITY AND PROVINCE

Lord and Lady Bessborough and Son, Lord Duncannon, Arrive at 5 p.m.—Civic Reception at City Hall—Lieutenant Governor Entertains Them at Public Reception. Tonight—The Program.

The City of Fredericton and the province of New Brunswick will pay official welcome to Lord and Lady Bessborough, and their son, Lord Duncannon, when they arrive here at five o'clock this afternoon (Daylight Saving Time). A civic welcome will be given at the city hall shortly after the arrival of the vice-regal party, and this evening at 9:30 o'clock His Honor Lieutenant Governor Hon. Dr. Murray MacLaren will tender a reception to Their Excellencies, the public being invited. It is the vice-regal party's last visit to the province.

The visit of Their Excellencies is their farewell to this province. The vice-regal party arrives from St. Andrews-by-the-Sea, where the party have been vacationing for the past two weeks.

His Worship Mayor W. G. Clark will deliver a farewell address to Their Excellencies upon their arrival at the city hall, shortly after five o'clock. The vice-regal party will be greeted upon their arrival at the Union Station by Lieutenant Governor MacLaren, Premier A. A. Dunsart, Brigadier R. O. Alexander, officer commanding Military District No. 7, and members of the federal and provincial cabinets who are in the city. They will be conducted at once to the city hall which has been appropriately decorated for the occasion.

In the vice-regal party besides Lord and Lady Bessborough and Lord Duncannon are Colonel E. D. MacKenzie, comptroller of the household; Captain D. Fisher-Rowe, A.D.C., and Captain M. E. Adeene, A.D.C.

### At City Hall

At the city hall His Worship Mayor Clark will present Lord and Lady Bessborough with a farewell address from the city. Mrs. Clark and the aldermen and their wives, as well as the general public will be present. His Excellency is expected to make a fitting reply and Lady Bessborough will be presented with a bouquet of flowers by little Miss Wright, daughter of Ald. Dr. Wright and Mrs. Wright.

His Excellency will present two Barker's Point youths with parchments given by the Royal Humane Society for life saving. The two are Raymond Gilks, son of Mrs. Teresa Gilks, and Frederick Grant, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence C. Grant, who rescued Robert Armstrong from drowning on May 9 in the St. John river. Hon. Dr. Hanson will present the boys to His Excellency who will then make the presentation. Afterwards the public will be presented to Their Excellencies.

Following the civic reception, the party will be taken on an automobile tour of the city and immediate surroundings and at 7:30 p.m. will attend a dinner at the home of Mayor and Mrs. Clark. At 9:30 they will attend the provincial reception to be held at the parliament buildings by the Lieutenant Governor.

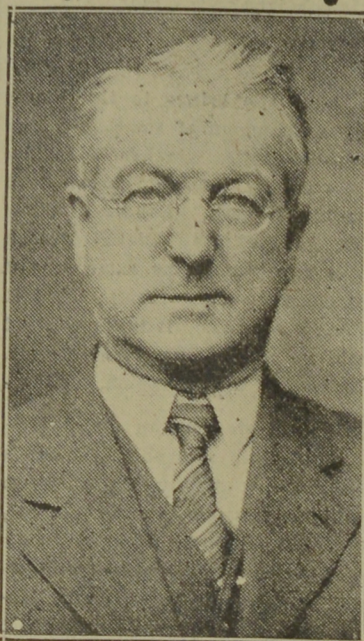
### DIED WHILE ON VISIT

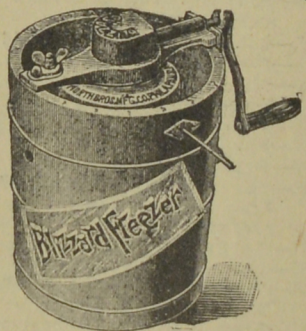

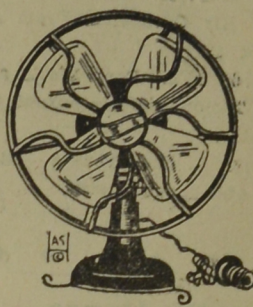
