LEADER KING **FAVORS TRADE** TREATY WITHU.S.

HALIFAX, Sept. 6-At a party rally here Mr. King made a statement in connection with trade relations be-tween Canada and the United States. tr. Bennett could have made a treaty ith the United States at any time in the last two years had it not been for the Empire trade agreements and his desire to prolong negotiations to serve his purposes in the election cam-paign, Mr. King charged. High tariffs imposed by the Bennett

Government will be removed gradu-ally under a Liberal regime, Mr. King said. A Liberal Government however, would "not injure a legitimate indus-try" by lowering tariffs, and would not take away any of the protection given Canadian industry prior to 1930. "So far as duties were imposed un-

der Sir Wilfred Laurier's regime and under the later Liberal Governments," said Mr. King, "all that was done for the good of the industry will be preserved and will not be destroyed. But so far as new, excessive and arbitrary tariffs have been imposed, we will lool at what has been done since 1930 and we will undo what has been done by the present Government in that direc-






