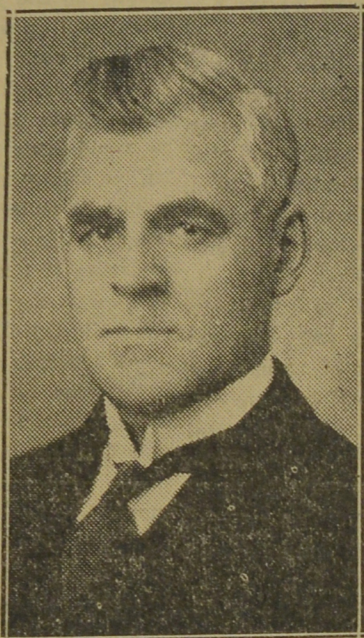


# GIVE DYSART HIS CHANCE TO PROVIDE WORK AND WAGES INSTEAD OF DOLE AND DESPAIR

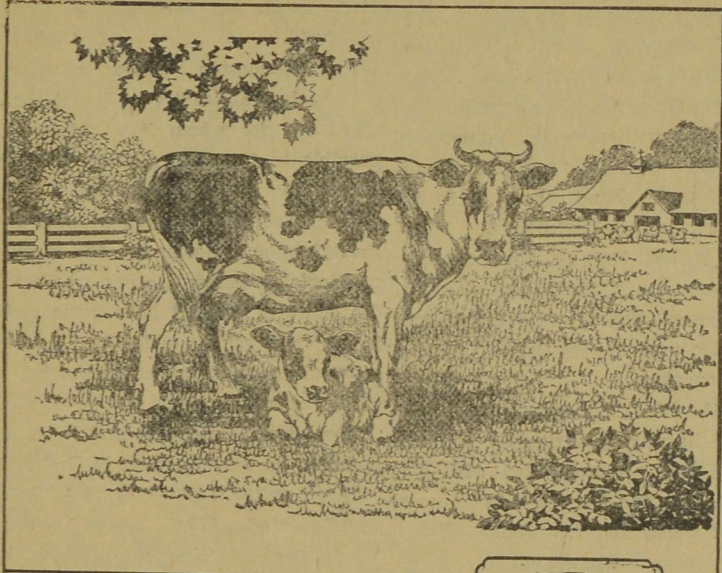

Even those, who may differ from Mr. Dysart politically admit that he is a splendid fellow personally; that he is a foeman worthy of anyone's steel. A man of fine appearance with splendid physique, he stands out among the crowd as one, whom any province might well delight to honor.

Perhaps no one in public life in this province has a more pleasing personality than Mr. Dysart. He feels himself to be "the equal and kindly brother of all". His friendly and engaging smile, his contagious chuckle, his equable temper endear him to everybody. Easy of approach, tactful, and diplomatic, always anxious to be of service, he occupies an outstanding place in the life of this province. "He bids them good morrow with a modest smile and calls them brothers".

A. Allison Dysart was born at Cocagne, Kent County, on March 22nd, 1880. He is the fourth of the six living sons of Andrew Knox Dysart of English and Scotch descent and of Henrietta Cutler of English descent.

Through his mother he is a grandson of the late Robert Cutler, who for many years was prominent in the political life of New Brunswick, both before and since Confederation; and a great grandson of Ebenezer Cutler the Loyalist, who accompanied the British fleet under Howe from Boston to Halifax in March, 1776. Dysart, by the way, is the name of a seaport town and royal and parliamentary burg in the county of Fife, Scotland.

His paternal grandfather, Robert Dysart, who settled at Cocagne in 1824, was a member of the Masonic Order and an Anglican in religion. He was one of the four founders of the Episcopal Church at Cocagne Corner. The old edifice still stands as a monument to the faithful work of its worthy builder. A few years ago this church was repaired and the burial grounds and church property improved at the personal expense of Mr. Robert Dysart, of Boston, brother of the Opposition Leader and grandson of its builder.

Allison Dysart, who belongs to the Catholic branch of the family, attended the country school in Cocagne, being affectionately called "Allie". He later studied at the Guelph Agricultural College, then at St. Joseph's College, Memramcook and at Dalhousie Law School, Halifax, from which Institution he received the degree of LL.B.

Since attending agricultural college, he has never lost his interest in farming, which is today one of his chief hobbies. He has probably a keener practical understanding of the present day difficulties and problems confronting the farmer, than any other man in public life in this province.

In September, 1916, Mr. Dysart was married to Miss Blanche C. McDougall, daughter of John J. McDougall of Glace Bay, Nova Scotia. Mrs. Dysart is a lovely lady possessing charm of manner, coupled with rare mental attainments. She is a sympathetic and capable helpmeet for her distinguished husband.

Mr. and Mrs. Dysart have two daughters, Mary, and Miriam, and one son, Robert.

He has been a member of the New Brunswick Legislature for eighteen years. He was first elected at the General Elections of 1917, and re-elected in 1920. On March 17th, 1921, he was elected Speaker, and continued to occupy that responsible position until the close of the session of 1925. In June, 1925, he was sworn in Minister of Lands and Mines in the Veniot Administration. He was re-elected at the general elections of 1925 and 1930, but on both occasions his party went down to defeat. In March, 1926, he was unanimously chosen leader of the Opposition in the Legislature.

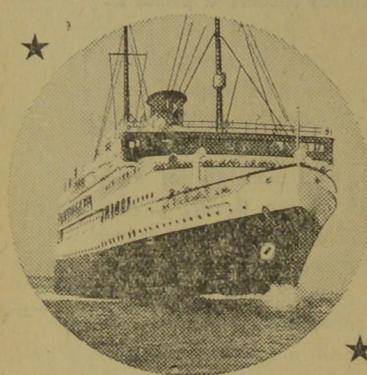
Mr. Dysart resides in Buctouche, where he successfully practices his profession as a lawyer. He has broad and tolerant views upon all subjects and is quick to recognize and appreciate the opinions of others. He has a happy faculty of smoothing out differences, unostentatiously but effectively. In fact Mr. Dysart is a kindly and courteous gentleman against whom no one can find any serious fault.

Mr. Dysart possesses in large measure notable qualities of leadership, both inherited and acquired. He comes from a family which is distinguished for its outstanding ability and renowned integrity. Two of his brothers, Harrison and Arthur are rising lawyers in Winnipeg; Robert and Hugh Dysart of Boston, are both prominent in their fields of public accountancy. Another brother, Hon. Andrew Dysart, presently in Ottawa is officially one of the judges of the Supreme Court, Kings Bench Division of Manitoba.

Mr. Dysart, who is confidently expected to be the next Premier of New Brunswick, will bring to that office outstanding mental and moral equipment and rich experience. He is a fluent, forcible speaker, easily the best in the Legislature recently prorogued. He has a consuming desire to be of public use to New Brunswick; to restore to this province government of the people, for the people and by the people.

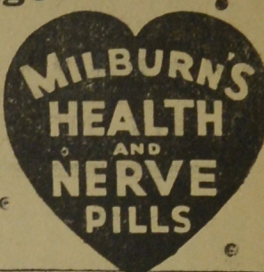
