Delegation From Chil-
dren's Home Ask That
Repairs Be Made

The City Council wound-up its May business, meeting in its regular meeting in the council chamber at the city hall last evening. The May committee meeting had been held last Friday evening. His Worship Mayor W. G. Clark presided at the meeting and the aldermen present were Moses Mitchell, C. Hedley Forbes, Ivan McKnight, T. Earle Doohan, David McCaughy, and Dr. H. S. Wright.

A delegation appeared before the Council asking for a grant of \$100 to help defray part of the expense bill for repairs to the Children's Home, the amount being \$134. The delegation was from the Children's Aid Society and was composed of Rev Dr. W. C. Kierstead, W. M. Burns, C. N. Goodspeed, and R. B. Wallace. The Council gave the Society \$350 of the yearly grant of \$1,800 and shelved the petition for the \$100 until a later date.

The Council also dealt with the matter of blanket insurance for the firemen. It was pointed out that certain individuals of the department were not within the scope of the blanket insurance carried in the department on account of their age. The City Council authorized the fire committee last night to take up the matter and make the necessary changes. As the insurance ends when the individual attains the age of 60, it was felt that he should be let go, the reason for this being that if a fireman not covered in the scheme be injured, the city would be liable.

MIDWEEK MARKET

Today's midweek market at Phoenix Square was a large one. The prices, which were about as they were on Saturday, follow: Hay, per ton, \$12. to \$14.; Eggs, per dozen, 20 cents; Butter, per lb., 25 cents; Beef per lb., 5 to 7 cents; Veal, per lb., 7 to 11 cents; Ham, per lb. 23 cents; Maple syrup, per bottle, 50 cents; Wood, per load, \$4 to \$6; Parsnips, per barrel, \$2.35; Potatoes, per barrel, 80 cents; Pork, per lb., 10 to 13 cents.

GAZETTE NOTICES

This week's issue of the Royal Gazette gives notice of the proclamation of three acts which will come into force in the province after the first day of May. The first is an act to provide for a measure of relief to be extended by a guarantee of bank loans to farmers. The second is "an act to provide for the establishment of Housing Commissioners in municipalities in the province of New Brunswick". A third is "an act for the prevention of fraud in connection with the sale of securities". All have been passed by order-in-council.

REBATE RATES
RE STUMPAGE IN
THE PROVINCE

Royal Gazette Publishes
Complete List Rebated
Stumpage Rates

Market Conditions

Workers' Complaints To
N. B. Forest Operations
Commission

The rebated stumpage rates for the province, authorized by an order-in-council passed April 26, and given publication in this week's Royal Gazette shows the completely revised rates, says the Gazette:

"The rates for stumpage will remain the same as now fixed. The Government will rebate \$1.00 stumpage per thousand feet on softwood long lumber and all softwood products except pulpwood if the English price for Eastern Canada lumber is less than last year. The determination as to the price is to be made by the Government by the first day of May next. The same proportionate rebate must be made by the licensee selling stumpage to take advantage of the proposed rate. The prices figured on will be F.A.S. New Brunswick Ports."

Premier Tilley, in view of the unsatisfactory condition of the English market for lumber and lower price now obtainable, now recommends that the following rebated stumpage rates be made effective as to August 1st, 1934, for the license year ending August 1st, 1935. The same proportionate rebate must be made by Licensees to purchasers of stumpage from their limits. And further provided that in all cases where workmen have filed complaints with the New Brunswick Forest Operations Commission respecting wages and where said complaints have not been satisfactorily adjusted, the rebated rate of stumpage shall not apply to the lumber cut from the lands held under license by the licensee.

The new rates:

White pine saw-logs, per M. superficial feet, \$2.50; red pine saw-logs, per M. superficial feet, \$2.00; spruce saw-logs per M. superficial feet, \$2.00; fir saw-logs per M. superficial feet, \$2.00; hemlock saw-logs, per M. superficial feet, \$2.00; cedar sawlogs, per M. superficial feet, \$2.00; princess pine saw-logs, per M. superficial feet, \$2.00; hachmatac saw-logs, per M. superficial feet, \$2.00; railway ties (hewn) pine, cedar, hemlock and hachmatac, 8 feet in length (culls included) each .10.

A NEW COMPANY

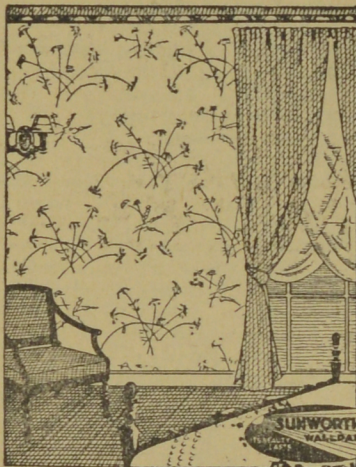

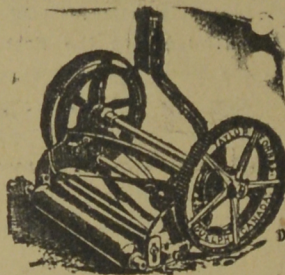
