And he's a most obliging feller as you ever saw.

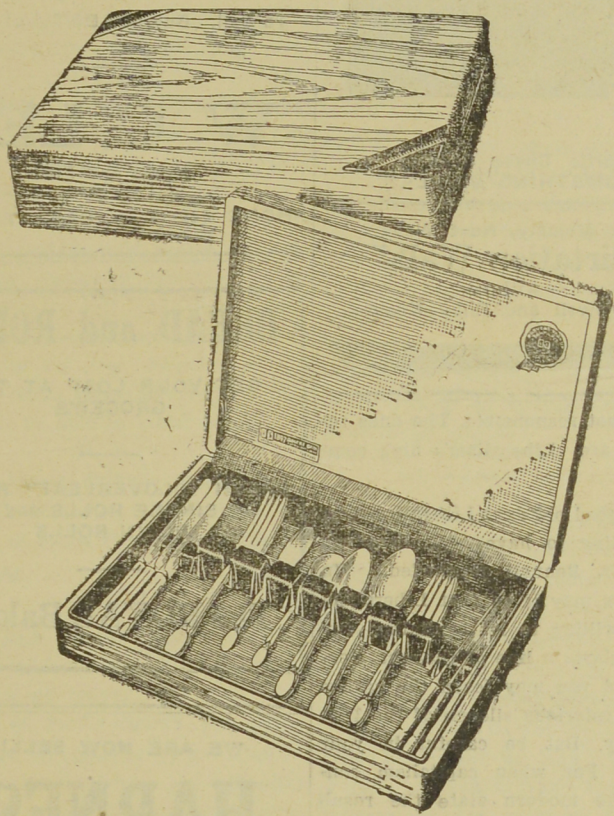
Our John are Johns of quality they're Johns upon the spot.

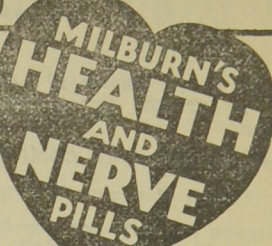

#### IRISH STEW WITH DUMPLINGS

Two pounds stewing beef  
2 carrots  
2 onions  
1 turnip  
4 potatoes  
Salt  
Pepper  
Cut meat into pieces for serving, roll in flour and brown well in butter or suet. Cover with water and simmer for an hour. Add diced vegetables and cook until meat and vegetables are tender. Season with salt and pepper. Make a dumpling batter of one egg, two tablespoons milk, a pinch of salt and enough flour to stiffen. Drop by spoonful into hot stew cover with a lid and cook for twelve minutes. Serve on a heated platter.

#### RICE GRIDDLE CAKES

Combine one cup warm boiled rice with one half teaspoon salt, two tablespoons melted butter and the yolks of two eggs. Add four tablespoons flour sifted with two teaspoons baking powder and lastly fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Bake on a hot greased griddle. Serve with butter and syrup.

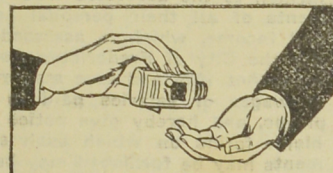

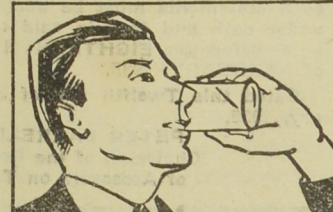

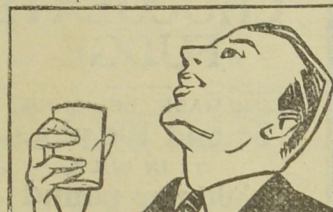
