ACT IS STRONGLY
RECOMMENDED

Support Bill

Protects Farmers

Law Practice-Procedure
Committee Considers
Five Others

A bill relating to the control and sale of dairy products was recommended this morning by the Committee on Law Practice and Procedure. The bill, which in short would authorize the appointment of a commission by the government to control the selling and handling of milk and cream in certain established areas, was heartily supported by Hon. Lewis Smith, Minister of Agriculture, and several representatives of farmers throughout the province.

Five other bills were recommended by the committee, including two bills to amend the Bills of Sale Act, a bill to amend the Illegitimate Children's Act, a bill to amend the Act respecting the division of the province into towns, parishes, etc., and a bill to amend the Life Insurance Act.

J. H. A. L. Fairweather, K.C., (Govt., Kings), occupied the chair.

Two bills to amend the Bills of Sale Act were combined and recommended by the committee, with slight amendments.

The committee also recommended a bill to amend the Act respecting Illegitimate Children, with slight amendments.

J. H. Ramsay, chief draughtsman, explained a bill to amend an Act respecting the division of the province into counties, towns and parishes. He pointed out that a correction in the original description of the boundary of Victoria county should be made.

The funeral will take place from the late home on Friday afternoon with services at two o'clock to be conducted by Rev. D. L. Kennedy. Interment is to be made in the Raymond burial ground at Upper Manguerville. Mrs. Sterling belonged to a prominent old family of Manguerville. She had many old friends both in Sunbury and in this city who will be sorry to learn of her death.

PAPER SUBJECT

The York-Sunbury Historical Society held one of its most successful meetings last night in the museum upstairs in the post office building. In the absence of the president, W. W. Hubbard, Rev. Dr. Wightman presided.

A feature of the evening was the attendance of Hon. Dr. Murray MacLaren, Lieutenant Governor of the province, who with Mrs. MacLaren, and Mrs. L. P. D. Tilley were keenly interested in the proceedings. Afterwards his Honor expressed himself as desirous of calling frequently and viewing the objects in the museum.

A splendid paper on "Reminiscences of St. Mary's Indian Reserve Fifty Years Ago", was read by Mrs. Nathan Squires. In the paper Mrs. Squires disclosed that her father had kept a store in Devon in the early days and many Indians had traded with him. He was able to learn much of their character, their habits and of their craftsmanship. All these things were brought out in Mrs. Squires' instructive paper.

Miss Eva Dedham, an Indian miss, gave a most pleasing recitation and a talk in the Maliseet tongue. She also sang a Miomac song, one which her father had taught her. This was a folk song of the Micmacs with the words and music originating from that branch of the Indians living in this province. Miss Dedham was dressed in Indian costume, wearing the traditional moccasins and was very charming.

During the evening Mrs. Tilley, wife of Premier Tilley, presented the Society with a picture of the sesquicentennial birthday cake of the city of Fredericton. She and His Honor Lieutenant Governor MacLaren and Mrs. MacLaren spoke briefly, expressing their pleasure in being present. His Honor was particularly interested in Miss Dedham's interpretations in the Maliseet tongue.

Previous to the regular meeting a brief executive meeting was held, with Major Good in the chair. Routine matters were discussed.

There was a splendid attendance of members and previous to the opening of the regular meeting, Rev. Dr. Wightman spoke and welcomed the Lieutenant governor's party.

PLANS BEING
MADE FOR VIMY
PILGRIMAGE

Local Branch Canadian
Legion To Discuss the
Matter Tonight

To Choose Committee

Committee to Deal With
Plans for Pilgrimage
In Year 1936

The local branch of the Canadian Legion will hold a dinner in connection with its regular monthly meeting this evening, at which time it is expected that a committee will be named to plan for the Vimy Pilgrimage in 1936. It is understood that the local branch has received considerable correspondence regarding this matter, and this will be taken up at tonight's meeting.

The date of sailing of the Canadian Legion pilgrimage to Vimy and the battlefields in 1936 has now been decided on as about July 15-16, which is several weeks later than was originally intended. Previous announcement had been that the pilgrimage would leave Canada some time about June 20 to June 25, 1936. The change in the date of sailing has been made in order to insure a minimum of three days in France and under the new arrangement the ships carrying the pilgrims will be held in the French port until the tour in France is over and will carry the troops and their relatives across to England and
