PERFORMANCES OF DOZEN 2 YEAR OLDS PROVIDE DEBATES ON KENTUCKY DERBY

NEW YORK, Nov. 15 — Trying to pick the winner of the 1936 Kentucky Derby may be just so much guesswork, but upwards of a dozen two-year-olds turned in performances this year that should furnish plenty of debate during the winter months.

Any horseman will tell you that a thousand-and-one things can happen before next May, that a champion juvenile may turn out to be a plater 3-year-old, or a horse unrated off its 2-year-old form may develop into another Man 'O War, a Twenty Grand or an Equipoise.

Lacked Consistency

Such things have happened and they can happen again, especially in view of the erratic performances turned in by the 2-year-olds this year. The class lacked consistency.

C. V. Whitney's Red Rain looked like a champion at Saratoga but folded up completely. Elmer Dale Shaffer's Codstream ran like a great 2-year-old in finishing in a dead heat with Red Rain at the Spa and taking the measure of the Whitney ace in the champagne at Belmont Park.

He too, however, was among the also-rans in the big test—the \$100,000 futurity at Belmont. Both are bred to go the route. However, Red Rain being by Pennant and Codstream by Bull Dog.

On the basis of performances, Hal Price Headley's Hollywood, Grand

Slam from P. A. Markey's Bomar stable and Mrs. Payne Whitney's Memory Book stand out as most plater 3-year-olds, or that a horse likely to prefer the longer distances to those 3-year-old stakes.

Hollywood was a bang-up second to Marshall Field's Tintagel in the Belmont futurity, finished second to mud-running Grand Slam in the Kentucky Jockey Club stakes, and then whipped the latter at one and one-sixteenth miles in the Pimlico futurity.

Jean Bart Shows Speed

Tintagel, rated only a sprinter, tops the money winning list with \$76,270. Then comes Grand Slam with \$68,095, Hollywood with \$64,745 and Red Rain with \$45,950.

Jean Bart, from Walter M. Jefford's stable, has showed flashes of great speed and may, like most Man 'O War colts, improve with age. The same goes for Ogden Phipps' White Cockade, sired by Diavolo, one of the greatest route horses of American turf history, and J. E. Widener's Brevity, forced into early retirement because of injuries.

Any list of the leading juveniles may include the Wheatley stable's Snak; Postage Due from Alfred Gwynne Vanderbilt's barns; Forever Yours, the ranking filly of her age, and the Fighter, both from Mrs. Ethel V. Mars' Milky Way farm, and split Second, which showed great promise in the silks of the King ranch.

MAPLE LEAFS DETROIT AND NOSE OUT NEW YORK RANGERS 1-0 SCORELESS TIE

NEW YORK, N. Y., Nov. 15 — Toronto Maple Leafs took their first victory of the new National Hockey League season and the New York Rangers their first defeat, 1-0 before a near capacity crowd of 15,000 last night.

A fine third-period goal by Harold "Buzz" Boll broke up an evenly contested battle and kept Toronto's two-game record clear of defeat. Leafs drew 5-5 with New York Americans in their first start.

Checked for 50 minutes by a hard working though crippled New York defense, the Leafs capitalized upon two lapses in the middle of the final period to gain the decision. Boll, going down the left alley, took an angle pass from Billy Thoms, circled Ott Heller on the defense, then out-guessed goalie Dave Kerr with a low shot to the inside corner of the cage. Kerr moved just far enough toward the opposite side to let the puck slide between his pads and the post.

DETROIT, Nov. 14 — Brilliant net-guarding featured a fast, well-played overtime scoreless tie through which Chicago Black Hawks and Detroit Red Wings battled tonight before 5,000 fans in a National Hockey League match.

Mike Karakas, playing his second game in the majors as a sub for the injured Lorne Chabot, regular Black Hawk net guardian gave a great exhibition, kicking out 26 hard drives. Norm Smith was equally good, stopping 28 Chicago shots.

Both teams had chances to clinch the game in the overtime stanza. After battling fairly evenly through the three regulation periods, the extra one opened with Vic Sorrell being benched for slashing Johnny Gottselig.

: SPORT SPOTS :

With the despatching of a telegram from Robin Kilburn to Fred Kelly, Wolfville, the curtain fell with a bang of the 1935 Fredericton City rugby season. That telegram, in reply to a request to have Caledonia play here Saturday in the McCurdy Cup finals, stated that City would be unable to meet the required guarantee to bring the Caledonians here, and that the season was too late anyway. The telegram pretty well expresses the general sentiment of all the players on the team. It is a shame that the City team could not have gone into the finals with some backing from the sporting men of the community. But the boys were left to struggle along on what they could scrape together themselves and only managed to play two exhibition games. Even though they have not the finances to play the finals, it is not their fault, and much credit is due Robin Kilburn, the manager, and the members of the squad for their genuine effort to keep rugby alive in Fredericton.

A figure well known in New Brunswick hockey circles was in the city yesterday. He is Brad Gilbert, well known as one of the most capable managers a Saint John hockey team ever had. He was in the city scouting for information regarding the proposed revival of the Southern N. B. League and apparently left well satisfied that the prospects for a league this year look mighty good. Speaking of the proposed pre-season game between the Saint John team and the Fredericton District team, he was very enthusiastic and thought it a fine idea. It is expected that, if they can be arranged, the two teams will carry on a pre-season series in Saint John before the Southern League opens about the first of the year.

Another hockey meeting is scheduled for tonight when it is expected that a club will be formed and an executive committee elected. The team, it is expected, is to be controlled entirely by the players and there is to be only one coach. This will avoid the difficulties that previous Fredericton teams have experienced, and give the players more of an interest in the club.

Ike Ferris, member of the Bank of Montreal team that was beaten by Caledonia in the McTier Cup playoffs of Remembrance Day, was in Fredericton yesterday. Ike will be remembered here as a star three-quarter man with Saint John High, Rothesay Collegiate and Saint John Trojans. He is employed now in the Head Office of the Bank of Montreal and is rated as one of their cleverest backs. He intimated that the Bank team is going after the McTier trophy again next year and that several new players are expected to join the squad before next season.
