

BOSTON ANGLERS SOJOURNING AT HARVEY STA.

Visited the City Yesterday on An Unsuccessful Search for the Jubilee Silver Dollars — Wanted Them As Souvenirs.

Cranberry Lake, near Harvey Station, noted for its mammoth trout, is at last, largely as the result of the efforts of George Speedy, game warden and forest ranger of that place, and his son, Douglas Speedy, beginning to attract the attention of American anglers. Douglas, who is a registered guide, attended the Sportsmen's Show at the Boston Garden a few weeks ago and made contacts with a number of people interested in trout fishing. His first party composed of Messrs. Gregory and Haughton, arrived on Monday of this week in response to a telegram and have been enjoying good sport. Yesterday they motored to the city in company with the Messrs. Speedy to do some shopping and incidentally to procure if possible some of the newly minted Canadian dollars to take home as souvenirs. In company with R. P. Allen, chairman of the Tourist Committee of the Board of Trade, they made a round of the banks of the city, but not one could be obtained. The only hope held out to the visitors was that they might be able to procure some of the coins on application on their return home to the Boston branch of a Canadian bank. The Bostonians stated that they were enjoying their sojourn at Harvey very much and intimated that later in the season they might make a try for salmon at the Hart's Island pool.

FIRE DAMAGE WAS \$300.

Two sheds, and a gasoline engine, the property of Parker Glasier, of Lincoln, were destroyed by fire in a fire which broke out this morning shortly before noon. The fire is believed to have originated in a spark from the passing C. P. R. train enroute to this city. The damage amounted to about \$300. Several times the fire caught on an adjacent barn but the "bucket brigade" formed from fire equipment from the Experimental Station, the Fraser's mills, and Oromocto fought the blaze successfully.

LIBERALS ANNOUNCE SEVENTEEN- PLANK PLATFORM AT PROVINCIAL CONVENTION HELD HERE YESTERDAY

More Than 800 Attend Spirited Convention — Dysart is Unanimously Proclaimed Leader — J. B. McNair and Hon. A. A. Dysart Were Chief Speakers — Several Women Delegates.

Seventeen major resolutions, comprising the entire platform of the Liberal party in the coming election on June 27th, were unanimously passed at the Provincial Liberal convention held here yesterday in the City Hall.

More than 800 enthusiastic delegates attended the convention which was presided over by J. B. McNair, Secretary of the New Brunswick Liberal Association. Among those who addressed the convention were Hon. A. A. Dysart, leader of the Liberal party, J. B. McNair, Senator A. B. Campbell, Sackville, A. P. Patterson, St. John; Mrs. Ora P. King, Sussex; Hon. W. F. Roberts, Saint John, who was first Minister of Health for New Brunswick; Senator W. E. Foster, Saint John; J. E. Michaud, M.P., Edmundston, and many of the Opposition members and new candidates. T. E. O'Leary, Saint John, acted as secretary of the convention.

There was an orchestra in attendance and at intervals during the proceedings the enthusiastic throng of delegates broke into songs ridiculing the Conservative leader and his party. The music was under the direction of Frank Bridgeo, Saint John.

J. B. McNair

J. B. McNair, chairman of the convention, remarked that it was fitting that the convention should be held in the capital city, and extended to the delegates a hearty welcome. He especially welcomed the women delegates who were well represented.

In speaking of the thirty-three accomplishments of the Conservative party, he said that although the Conservatives had the voting franchise of women listed. It was the Liberals who first promoted this idea and that it was stolen from them by the Tories.

The chairman particularly invited the young people to join the Liberal ranks, exclaiming "We invite you into our ranks, not into vanity clubs."

He said that there is a place for all in the great work of reconstruction before us.

Mr. McNair said that Premier Tilley on the floor of the House had made insidious comparisons between members of the opposition and government "We will let Mr. Tilley measure a little while longer with the Conservative yardstick which measures a man from the chin down, but after June 27th we will measure with the Liberal yardstick which measures a man from the chin up."

He claimed that the Conservatives had stolen Liberal policies and added, "It is better that they steal our policies than your money."

In conclusion he said that a political platform should be drawn up on a broad scale. "A platform is important, but not as important as the selection of men to lead the party," he concluded.

Platform Committee

The platform committee was then selected as follows: Hon. Fred Magee, W. S. Anderson, H. O. Downey, F. W. Pirie, C. T. Richard, Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberts, E. J. Henneberry, C. C. Avard, F. O. Creighton and W. W. V. Foster. On motion by F. O. Creighton and seconded by C. T. Richard a resolution of loyalty to the leader, Hon. A. A. Dysart, was adopted by the convention.

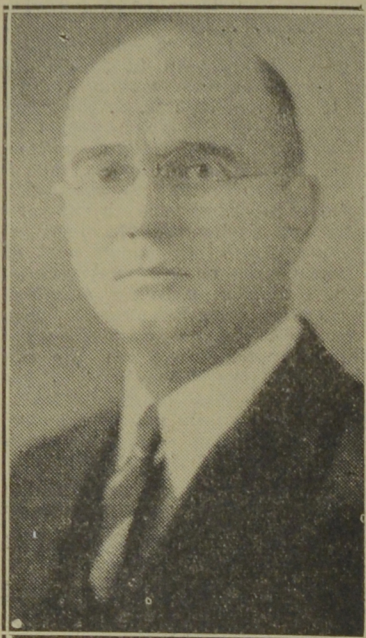

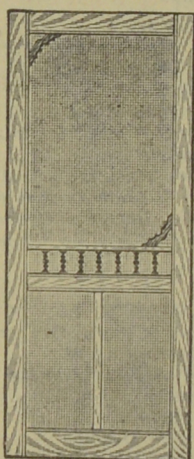
