Compared with direct relief expenditure of \$1,110,345.30 recorded for the period September 1, 1932, to September 30, 1933, the figure for the fiscal year 1933-34 represents a reduction of \$524,235.54.

Of the total amount, \$231,960.99 was spent on country relief and the remaining \$354,248.77 among the cities and towns, Sunbury with \$206.82, showed the lowest expenditure among the counties. Queens required but \$570.80. Among the towns, Bathurst, Dalhousie, St. Andrews, and Sunny Brae required no expenditure.

Figures Compared

Comparison of figures for the first and last months of the period under review show the decrease in relief requirements during the past year. In October 1933, the total number of persons on direct relief in New Bruns wick was 18,026. In October, 1934, the number had dropped to 6,399.
