NEW YORK, May 1—The transcontinental and western air mystery transport plane set a new transcontinental flight record for transport planes when it flew over Flody Bennett Field here at 6:59 p.m. E.S.T., tonight, completing the flight in eleven hours, five minutes.

The plane left Union Air Terminal, Los Angeles, at 7:54 a.m. E.S.T., and fought dust storms en route, and maintained a speed well over 200 miles an hour.
