Kate Smith  
Turns Operatic  
New-Star Revue

Kate Smith will turn operatic on her New-Star Revue broadcast over the WABC-Columbia network on Monday, February 11, from 8:30 to 9:00 P.M., when she sings the aria, My Heart at Thy Sweet Voice, from Saint-Saens' opera "Samson and Delilah," as the highlight of her program. Kate Smith first sang this selection with the Philadelphia Orchestra, with Leopold Stokowski conducting, in the fall of 1933. Appearing as guest artists on Monday's half-hour revue will be the New York audition winners—Cahn's Melody Four and Harold Brinkman, tenor—who were selected from more than 2,600 entrants in the Manhattan area. The four young women who compose the singing group are Jean and Rose Cahn, Julia Lewis and Ruth Robertson. All are former college students and come from the South. For this network debut they will sing "Resurrection." Brinkman, a former student at the University of Alabama, now is employed as a bank clerk. While attending high school at Ramsey, N.J., he organized his own orchestra, playing trombone and singing solos.

The Hudson-Terraplane program will open with "Limehouse Blues," by the orchestra, under Jack Miller, and Kate Smith's trio—the Three Ambassadors, in contract to her operatic aria, Kate will sing "I Get a Kick Out of You," and "Anything Goes."

CANADIAN RADIO COMMISSION  
PRESENTS MEIGHAN, SHAKESPEARERt. Hon. Mr. Meighan  
Speaks Movingly and  
Beautifully on the Bard  
on the Airwaves Tonight.

Members of the Ottawa Canadian Club are still discussing the remarkable address given before that organization two weeks ago by the Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighan. No other non-political event has made so pronounced an impression in the capital in a long time. Senator Meighan's address was on Shakespeare and he gave it the title, "The Greatest Englishman in History." In his audience were leading Canadian statesmen and diplomatic representatives of other countries and they, like others, were held spellbound by the beauty and moving qualities of the address. It was recognized that it would rank as a notable performance anywhere in the English-speaking world.

Realizing that many thousands of Canadians throughout the country would appreciate the privilege of hearing this address and derive great enjoyment and profit from it, the Canadian Radio Commission has secured Mr. Meighan's consent to the broadcasting of it over its national coast to coast network. For the purpose of this broadcast it has been arranged

through the co-operation of the Montreal Committee of the National Council of Education for Mr. Meighan to repeat the address before a Montreal audience on Monday evening, February 11. He will speak under the auspices of the National Council of Education in the Montreal High School and microphones will pick it up there for the Commission network.

The broadcast will commence at 9:00 P.M. and continue for most of the hour. The regular scheduled programme, "One Hour With You," is being cancelled for that hour.

The Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission believes this address will be recognized throughout Canada as among the most notable broadcasts since the inception of the national radio system and is marking February 11 as a red-letter day on its broadcasting calendar. The address will be made available to all stations on the national network and 9:00 P.M. is the time.

Harold Brinkman, tenor, and Cahn's Melody Four, a unique girls' quartet, who were adjudged the winners among 2,600 auditionists in the New York district tryouts for Kate Smith's program, will make their debuts on her New-Star Revue over the WABC-Columbia network on Monday, February 11, from 8:30 to 9:00 P.M.
