#### MUSTARD PICKLES

1 quart cukes, cut fine.  
1 quart cauliflower.  
1 quart green tomatoes.  
1 quart white onions.  
Soak overnight in a brine made of one quart water to one cup of salt. In the morning let it come to a boil in brine and drain.

#### Dressing

6 tablespoons mustard.  
1 tablespoon tumeric  
1 cup flour  
2 cups white sugar  
2 cups vinegar.  
Boil until thick and pour over vegetables. Heat to a boiling point, bottle and seal.

#### Lemon Pie

1 cup white sugar  
1 cup boiling water  
1 teaspoon butter  
3 egg yolks  
2 teaspoons powdered sugar  
2 tablespoons Purity Flour  
4 tablespoons lemon juice

Grated rind of 1 lemon  
Mix flour with white sugar, add boiling water, stirring constantly. Cook 2 minutes, add butter and egg yolks, lemon rind and juice, stirring constantly. Cool. Pour filling into pie shell. Cover with meringue made as follows:

Beat 3 egg whites until stiff, gradually adding 3 teaspoons powdered sugar. Brown in slow oven.

#### AIR BATH VITAL TO BED CLOTHES

If you were to walk into ten homes and watch the housewife make beds you would probably find at least five of them who would overlook some phase of bed care. How efficient are you? Here are the steps, so you can act as your own efficiency expert.

#### Airing Comes First

The first thing in the morning the bed should be aired and let it air at least one hour, preferably all morning and then make it at the end of the other household tasks.

aired and each piece of bedding been given a good air bath then it is time to make it up. The first step is to see that the mattress pad is placed on smoothly and tightly drawn if it is the type that can be tucked in. If the cover is just the size of the top of the bed then the sheet should serve to hold it in place.

The undersheet should be placed right side up with the middle of the sheet in the middle of the bed because sheets put on zig-zag fashion tend to wear sooner. The wide hem end should be placed at the head and well tucked in as should the bottom and sides of the sheet. The uppersheet should be put on right side down with the wide hem at the top. This sheet should be tucked in firmly at the bottom and if it is the right size there will be enough sheet at the top to fold over the blanket to protect it. Next the blankets should be tucked in at the bottom and sides. If double blankets are used the open edges should be at the head of the bed. It is really an economy to cut double blankets in two and then if one half is not used it won't be dragging on the floor picking up dust and dirt.
