Action Taken To Prevent Epidemic In Gloucester

Within the next few days the New Brunswick Department of Health will carry out a sanitary survey in Gloucester county, the object being to prevent an outbreak of diseases or an epidemic among the forest fire sufferers many of whom have lost their homes and at present are living in less habitable conditions.

This survey will be made at the urgent suggestion of Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberts, Minister of Health and Labor, and Dr. J. E. Paulin will be in charge of the survey work.
