MUNICIPAL HOME AT DOUGLAS MAY BE JAIL FARM

Movement Afoot to Buy Springhill Hotel Property For New Home

Jail Farm Needed

Discussion of these Matters Carried on Last Week

A movement is on foot to purchase the Springhill hotel property and to remove the Municipal Home at Douglas to that place. In this connection there has also been proposed that the Municipal Home property which consists of a large farm, substantial buildings and up to date farm machinery, be disposed of to the proper authorities to be used as a jail farm. At the present time there are fifty old people and forty children on this poor farm at Douglas and not one of them are able to do any farming. If these were moved to Springhill the property which they now occupy would make an ideal place for a jail farm.

When the Municipal Home property was purchased some years ago, from the Morgan Estate it cost the county of York \$20,000 for the land, and the buildings were erected by Contractor Forbes at a cost to the county of \$80,000. At the time that this purchase was made, a large number of the county councillors had their eyes on the Doherty property at Springhill and the purchase of that property was only decided against by a majority of two votes. It is felt that if the municipality of York could sell this farm for anywhere near its original value it would not only be able to purchase the Doherty place, familiarly known as the Springhill Hotel property, but the proceeds would go a long ways towards reducing the bonded indebtedness of the county.

Another advantage would be that the jail farm advocated by Judge Slipp, The Daily Mail and others would become an assured fact and whereas the present municipal farm cannot be worked by the inmates and has to be worked by hired help in the case of its being a jail farm it would be worked by the inmates themselves. A meeting of one of the committees of the county council was held during the past week and the matter was discussed along the lines outlined in this news story. It was felt that if anything were done in the matter that a good time to act would be the present, before the season got too far advanced, so far advanced that the change would interfere with the farming arrangements.

Lipsett, Saint John, and Mrs. James Snyder, Detroit, Mich. The funeral will take place on Tuesday afternoon with prayers at the late home at two o'clock and service at the United Church at 2.30 o'clock by Rev. Mr. Manuel. Interment will be made in the Methodist church cemetery. The late Mrs. Pyne was an energetic worker on behalf of the church at Marysville and was revered and respected by all.

FREIGHT RATES

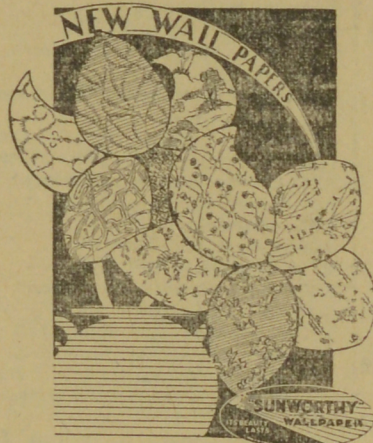

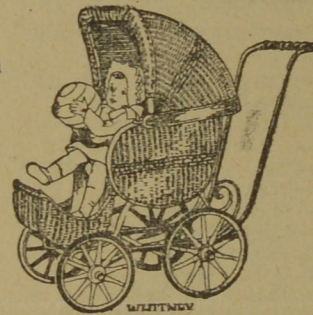
