### CARE FOR HAIR AFTER A PERMANENT

"Correct care of the hair after a permanent wave is just as important as the pre-permanent routines to get it in healthy condition to withstand the winding and heat," said a well-known hairdresser.

"The woman who has to get a new permanent every six months or so should make up her mind to have or give herself a weekly scalp treatment as well as a shampoo and wave."

This certainly sounds like reasonable advice. After all, no matter how expert your operator is, and regardless of the brand of pads she uses, the fact remains that lotions and enough heat are applied to make straight hair actually curly for half a year or longer.

The entire process, although harmless and entirely satisfactory these days, is bound to be a shock to any scalp and head. To alleviate dryness that sometimes occurs after a permanent, and to get the hair back to normal scalp treatments are essential.

Hot oil, of course, is one of the best reconditioners in the world. The night before you plan to wash your hair, massage warm olive oil into your scalp. For the first ten treatments after a permanent, rub a little oil on the hair itself. Wrap a towel around your head and leave the oil on all night. Next day shampoo in the usual manner, washing and rinsing, washing again and rinsing two or three times.

The first month after you have had a new permanent is the one time when you shouldn't brush hair and scalp. The ends may be a trifle brittle and to brush vigorously may break them off. Instead, massage scalp with fingertips every night before you go to bed. If you have dandruff or some other ailment, apply a tonic to correct it before you begin to massage.

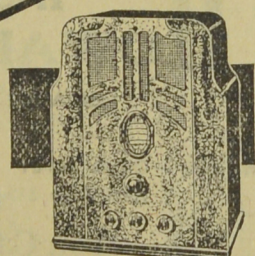

# McADAM and HARVEY AND THEIR BUYING OPPORTUNITIES

## 60 WOMEN TO SEEK SEATS IN BRITISH HOUSE

More Than 30 Nominated By Laborites. Including Some Prominent Personages—Many For Baldwin.

LONDON, England, Sept. 21—Between 50 and 60 women, divided among all three political parties, are expected to stand at the next general election. These include all the Conservative women M. P.'s now in the House, together with several other women since adopted more than 30 Labor women, and at least four Liberal women candidates including Miss Megan Lloyd George, M. P. for Anglesey, and the only Liberal woman in the present House of Commons. Others are definitely negotiating for seats.

Of the last, three are Scotswomen—Miss M. G. Cowan, who will contest the east division of Edinburgh in the Conservative interests; Mrs. Margaret Small of Perth, who is a Labor candidate for Paisley; and Mrs. Jean Mann of Glasgow, who intends to stand for Renfrew West in the Labor interests.

One Cabinet Minister  
Many of the women have already gained valuable parliamentary ex-

perience. These include Lady Noel Buxton, a former Labor woman M. P.; Miss Susan Lawrence, at one time parliamentary secretary to the board of education, who is contesting Stockton (Durham); Miss Ellen Wilkinson, who is standing for Jerrow, and Rt. Hon. Margaret Bondfield, the Labor candidate for Wallsend, who was the first and, so far the only woman in this country to become a cabinet minister.

Mrs. Clara Rackham, who is standing for Saffron Walden (Essex) in the interests of Labor, is a noted expert on local government. Mrs. Leah Manning, the Labor candidate for Sunderland, is a noted educationist. Miss Dorothy Woodman is a specialist on international affairs. Mrs. Celia Borrett, who is contesting the Stroud division of Gloucestershire, was the first woman to be appointed as a British Broadcasting Corporation announcer, though for a short period. Mrs. Barbara Ayrton Gould, who is standing for Hulme (Manchester), is the wife of Gerald Gould, the literary critic, and a sister of the late Hertha Ayrton, the scientist and inventor.

### Two Are Doctors

Among the candidates are two women doctors, one of whom, Dr. Edith Summerskill, has already contested, though unsuccessfully, a by-election. The other medical woman is Dr. Elizabeth Jacobs, who is standing for St. Marylebone, London. Miss Monica Whately, a grand-daughter of the late Archbishop Whately, who is contesting Clapham, London, is an eloquent speaker and very active in the woman's movement.

Of nearly 500 National-Conservative candidates selected to take the field whenever the general election comes on, eight are women who will be fighting seats at present in opposition hands. They are: Mrs. Diana Spearman (Poplar South), Miss Bridget Jackson (Derbyshire, Clay Cross),
