



ured in his parliamentary declara tions. Canada's naval ambitions and resources are to be merged with those of Great Britain, if Mr. Borden re mains in control, upon some basis, vet to be determined, which will per mit a technical defence being made to the charge that the Canadian policy is one of contribution to a body over which they nave no control. TI will be, nevertheless, a policy of contribution with the further possibility that the extent of these contributions will not be determined by the Canaadian Parliament but by an organization sitting in London, upon which Canada will have merely a nominal representation.

If the people of British Columbia want a Canadian fieet unit they will have to ally themselves with the Liberal party. They will have to choose between the interests of the country as they see them and their allegiance to a party name. Mr. Borden is a Centralist and the advocate of a centralized navy
